JESSE ALLEN DIES OF CAR INJURIES

Mr. Jesse Allen of 1438 North 20th St. was struck by an auto driven by Mrs. Eva Heller of 532 North 25th St on July 16, and died July 18 at the Lord Lister Hospital.

White Man Get Anderson's Internal Revenue Job in New York

NEW YORK CITY July 14 - (CN S)—Harlem's Democratic leaders are sorely peeved. A white man has been selected to succeed Charles W. Anderson as Collector of Internal Revenue in the Third District of New York.

Sigmund Solomon gets the plum that Henri W. Shield, James C. Thomas, Dr. Godfrey Nurse, and John M. Royall were striving for.

Charles W. Anderson, who is retiring from political office after more than forty years in Federal and State Service, was Collector of Internal Revenue for the 3rd District under President Harding, Coolidge, Hoover, and F. D. Roosevelt. During the Harding Administration, G. O. P. leaders had the old Second District divided so as to provide collectorship appointment for the astute Negro leader.

Mr. Anderson was first named Collector of Internal Revenue by President Theodore Roosevelt at the request of Booker T. Washington, serving in charge of the Second District during the Administrations of Roosevelt, Taft, and Wilson for several months. His first political appointment was gauger in the Second

District in 1890. He had been in ill health since 1827. For months the administrative duties of the Third District have been carried on by subordinates.

Mrs. John True, while casting his throw line in the river at the Douglas Street bridge on July 14, caught the hook in his finger, and went on assisted to police station for treatment.

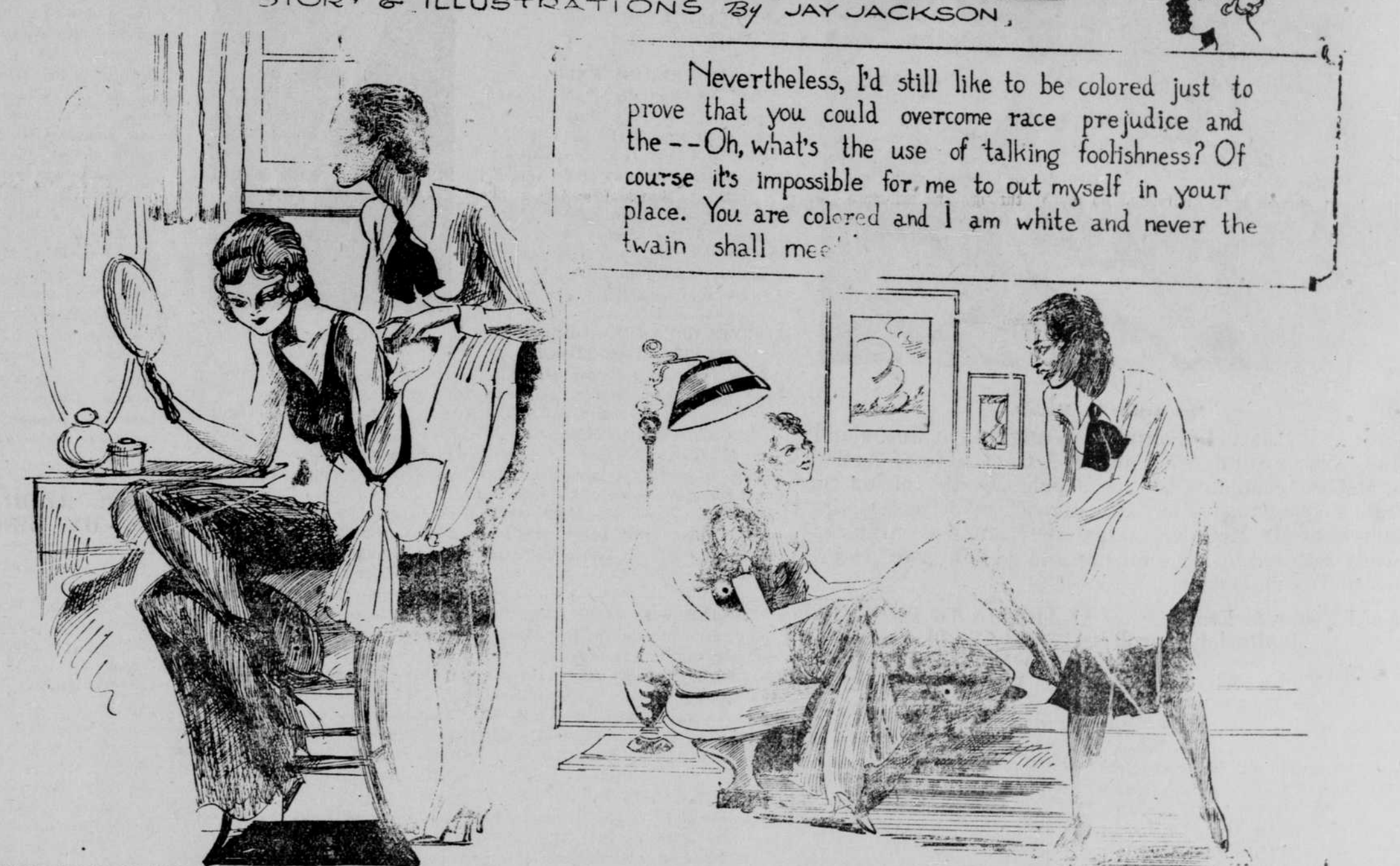
