



Shall the few Decide for the Many?

Six weeks ago, 268 cf the 687 employes of the street car company went on strike, led by an out-of-town paid organizer.

In other words, only 39% of the employes did not want to work. 61% chose to keep their jobs.

In the past six weeks, spurred on by the paid organizer, this organized minority has resorted to various methods in an attempt to force their will upon the unorganized majority who DO want to work.


As a result of the strike, property has been destroyed, men have been injured while working at their jobs, street-car passengers have been terrorized, business has suffered, and the public of Omaha and Council Bluffs has been put to serious inconvenience.

In America, it is a fundamental principle that the majority shall decide.
