of the air corps. These two men struggled side by side ten years ago when everything they did along aeronautical lines had to be kept secret, because of opposition from local white flyers. They made untold sacrifices to further themselves and to encourage other Negroes to take air interest in aviation. It was these at the Aeronautical University, 1338 South Michigan Avenue; the only accredited university in the United States that will accept members of our race. These are only a few of the things that they have done. At the conclusion of Miss Brown's talk the planes could be seen coming only a short distance away. They circled over at High Noon, dropped the wreaths in honor of 'Brave Bessie' and then headed back to the airport. The ships were piloted by the following men: Commander Lieut. Col. Cornelius R.
