A school for Swedish inventors has been opened at Stokholm.

Six wool fingers make up a new brush for cleaning the slats of Venetian shades.

Ski shaped skates for rapid travel over snow have been invented in Switzerland.

Stail electricity has been harnessed to run a motor invented by a Minnesota man.

An attachment for residence telephones in England summons police if burglars enter.

If a watch gains or loses one second in 11 days its errors can be detected by a new electric device.

Russians have invented electrically charged nets to reduce the cost and labor of catching sea fish.

Machines that draw and form solid steel tops for automobiles subject each top to a pressure of 5200 tons.

The wings of a new English seaplane arch upward and carry the motors at the highest points to escape spray.

Operated by compressed air, a chain type saw has been invented to cut off piling and do other work under water.

Glass cases to display goods sold have been invented in Germany to be carried on the rear of passenger automobiles.

Operated by the same current, electric chimneys have been invented to replace door bells and produce more pleasing tones.

Control surfaces of a novel French airplane are carried on a mast that rises vertically from the center of the fuselage.

An upholstered high chair has been invented that can be converted into a seat and table to hold playthings for an infant.

For coaching rowing crews an Englishman has invented a megaphone which uses electricity to amplify words spoken into its mouth-piece.

An instrument has been invented that spins a jacked up automobile wheel at high speed and records the amount that it may be out of true.

Electric apparatus has been invented in Germany for destroying documents, grinding the paper into bits so small that they cannot be reunited.

Metal muzzles to prevent chickens picking other birds without interfering with their eating and drinking have been invented by a Seattle man.

Using two systems of transmission, a television broadcasting station is being constructed in London that will be able to serve 10,000,000 persons.

Only three countries having more than 100,000 telephones each, Russia, China and New Zealand, cannot be reached by telephone from the United States.

Reversible rubber heels for shoes have been invented in Germany that can be turned over when worn down and slid on metal holders to provide fresh surfaces.

Plugging into a socket, a new electric presser can be used to crease trousers while they are being worn or press both sides of a garment at the same time.

British government scientists have established a laboratory to study the causes of motor vehicles skidding with a view to developing anti-skid highway surfaces.

Tests of electric lamps in artificial-

ly produced fogs in a New Jersey laboratory have shown that increasing the voltage increases the penetration of fogs by light.

Brazil has limited the granting of hydroelectric power concessions to Brazilians or enterprises in which 60 per cent of the voting stock is owned by Brazilians.

A socket wrench that fits all square and hexagonal nuts up to two and a half inches has been invented that has special plugs for insert nuts and a hammer attachment.

Hot bed sash for growing plants has been invented in England that is made in sections, enabling a gardener to arrange sections in any form and to any extent desired.

Music like that of a pipe organ is produced electrically by a new instrument now being manufactured on a commercial scale and sold at about the price of a fine piano.

The Brazilian government has established certain standards for butter and its substitutes, requiring inspection and chemical analysis and strict labeling of products.

The third planetarium in the United States, recently erected at Los Angeles, contains several features not included in its predecessors at Chicago and Philadelphia.

A coin-in-a-slot machine has been invented in England for public places that enables a person to write a message for a friend to read at any time up to two hours later.

A spring handle has been invented to snake down the mercury in a medical thermometer with less liability of breaking the instrument than when the work is done by hand.

Began 30 years ago and recently completed, Mexico City's Palace of Fine Arts includes a theater having a mosaic curtain containing more than a million pieces of glass.

Made of curved, enameled wood, a platform that can be attached to the stern of a life boat with clamps has been invented to assist in taking into the boat a rescued person.

An English railway is running what is asserted to be the world's fastest newspaper train, delivering London morning papers to a point in Wales 113 1/2 miles away in 137 minutes.

Weighing only 4.63 pounds per horsepower, an 80 horsepower gasoline motor made largely of aluminum has been designed to drive 16-foot speed boats at a rate of 60 miles an hour.

A sloping metal roof 120 feet long and 100 feet wide has been erected in a New Mexico city to catch infrequent rain water and drain it into a storage tank for watering livestock.

A German inventor has enabled a standard automobile to be used on land or water by substituting hollow drum shaped pontoons for its wheels, the rear pontoons being fitted with paddles.

A new lawn roller is covered with spikes that cut out and carry away small pieces of soil, the holes afterward being filled with top dressing and fertilizer to reach the roots of the grass.

Persons seeking information in a London railway station press buttons in a new machine bearing the names of stations to which they wish to go and receive cards telling when the next trains leave.

For reproducing delicate designs on metals a process has been developed with which patterns made of thread impregnated with rubber are laid on surfaces to be decorated, which then are sandblasted.

A huge air filled globe to give the craft stability features a helicopter

type flying machine invented in France, which can be raised vertically and held stationary in the air with four propellers.

A process has been developed at the United States Forest Products Laboratory in Wisconsin for impregnating woods used in flooring and furniture with wax so deeply that the finish is permanent.

Motion pictures of oil burning in Diesel engine cylinders made through heat resistant glass have shown that combustion occurs after the fuel fills the cylinders, not as soon as it enters as heretofore believed.

An island in the ocean a quarter of a mile off the English coast has been linked with the mainland by a ferry running on wheels on the sea bottom, passengers riding on a platform elevated above the water.

Weighing only 18 pounds, a new radio course indicator for airplanes is adjustable to either long or short wave transmission and can be installed in any part of a plane and operated by a pilot by remote control.

For protection of livestock an appliance has been invented that sends an electric current harmless to human beings, horses and cattle but deadly to predatory animals through wire fencing at five-second intervals.

Internal combustion engines have been invented in Germany to propel submarines beneath the surface of the water as well as on the surface using oil on surface runs and a mixture of hydrogen and oxygen when submerged.

First aid equipment at an English ambulance station includes asbestos clothing to be worn by men who drag with long tongs and a portable crane to hoist an injured person from a manhole.

A French inventor's touring trailer to be towed by an automobile is only 37 feet long when being towed but can be extended to 55 feet when stationary, affording living and sleeping, dining and toilet rooms and a kitchen.

Scientists have discovered that in the first five years a child's face grows more horizontally than vertically and after that more vertically than horizontally, also that heads of males continue to grow later in life than females.

While no mob violence is expected, according to reports, the prisoner will be closely guarded and every precaution will be taken to forestall any attempt that might be made to lynch him when he is brought to trial and further it is reported that Negroes will be placed on the jury.

Charge Brothers With Murder

Raleigh, N. C., Aug. 22 (ANP)

—William and John Rogers were held in the county jail here Wednesday morning after confessing that they shot and killed Willie Simmons near here Sunday night. William Rogers confessed that he fired the fatal shot.

The brothers were arrested Tuesday night at their home. William was in bed asleep at the time the officers arrived and John was sitting on the back porch. Neither made any attempt to escape and were carried to the jail for questioning. William told the officers that the shooting resulted from an argument over a barbecue sandwich.

According to his statement, with which his brother concurred the three men were at a barbecue stand and each purchased some barbecue. An argument started and Simmons threatened to strike John Rogers. The proprietor quieted the men and all of them went out. Simmons going to his home on Freeman street followed by the two brothers.

Following Simmons in the house and resuming the argument William Rogers pulled a gun and threatened to "shoot his heart out". Simmons laughed at him and becoming angry William then took the revolver and fired five shots in Simmons' direction, two of them taking effect and wounding him fatally.

Fear Lynching; Remove White Man For Safekeeping

He is Charged With Rape.

Jackson, Miss., Aug. 21, (ANP)—Fearing that the good old Southern custom of lynching might find a reaction in the lynching of a white man and that the lynchers might be spurred on by the knowledge of the laxity of authorities in dealing with those who in the past six weeks have lynched four Negroes, G. C. Chambers, a 26-year-old white man was rushed from the Scott county jail to Hinds county Wednesday night.

Chambers is charged with raping a 13-year-old white girl in Scott county. He was arrested Tuesday morning and when the report of his arrest was circulated the feeling against him reached fever-heat but not to the point of lynching—he was a white man. But officers "to prevent any possibility of mob violence" ordered him removed to the Hinds county jail.

Seriously Wounded in Gun Battle With Officers

Wilmington, N. C., Aug. 22—(ANP)—James Knox was shot and seriously wounded in a gun battle between himself and two police officers here Monday night. Frank Meier received a scalp wound and C. D. Hare suffered a "lacerated coat sleeve" in the battle.

According to the report of the officers, Knox was being sought by them and they came upon him near the baseball park. When he saw the officers approaching he fired three shots at them and continued to meet them despite the fact that they were returning fire. Reaching Officer Hare, he grappled with him in an effort to take his gun from him. The officer succeeded in twisting the gun inward and pulled the trigger, the bullet entering Knox's stomach. He was rushed to the James Walker hospital where his condition was pronounced serious.

Succumbs to Prejudice in Ole Miss: Moves CCC Camp

Yazoo City, Miss., Aug. 22—(ANP)—Federal authorities in charge of the establishment of CCC Camps in this section finally capitulated to prejudice of whites in and about here and the CCC Camp established for Negroes at Benton will be moved to another section of the state and supplanted by one for white youths.

Negro youths were sent here four weeks ago, over the protest of whites to begin work on the soil erosion project. During the time they have been here no work has been done due to the opposition of the whites and Tuesday it was announced that the work would be suspended until the Negroes could be replaced by white youths.

Cook's Home Gives Up Valuable Loot

Memphis, Tenn., Aug. 22—(ANP)—Goods, including silverware, linens, furs, clothing and heirlooms, that have been missing from a score or more of homes for the past several months were found in the home of Carrie Lockhart, who had served as cook in those homes from which the goods had been pilfered when she was arrested here Wednesday.

The woman was arrested when she returned to the house where she was working as a cook, Wednesday night, clad in overalls and with a stocking cap on her head. She was in the act of burglarizing the house when the officer neighbors arrived and placed her under arrest. She told officers she has been burglarizing the homes of employers, garbed as a man in the evening, for more than two years.
