HARMONY CHURCH CCC CAMPS AT FORT BENNING, GA. SET SAFETY RECORDS

The Harmony Church Negro CCC
Camps, located on the United States
Army reservation at Fort Benning,
Georgia, have made a one-hundred-
percent safety record in the Fourth
Corps Area life saving school con-
ducted in cooperation with the Amer-
ican Red Cross this summer. Nine
colored CCC enrollees of the Har-
mony Church camps were selected
for the course by the commanding
officers and all of the nine boys re-
ceived senior life saving certifi-
cates upon successful completion of
the training course. They were Sam
Mickens, James Wilder, Elvy Benning
Ephram Woods, Willie Barber, T. J.
Wiley, Julius Osborn, William P.
Thomas and Dan McGill. Fifty-sev-
en out of two hundred enrollees at
Harmony Church also received Stan-
dard First Aid certificates of the
Red Cross for completion of courses
covering the first aid principles of
treating injuries. Five members re-
ceived advanced certificates qual-
ifying them for teaching first aid work.
The twenty leaders and assistant
leaders and the supervisory force as-
signed to every CCC camp are re-
quired to earn First Aid certificates,
with the result that a number of ac-
cidents in the camps have shown a
marked decrease.

be connected with the classroom
—with the pupils and with the
room itself. The classroom should
have a cheerful, sunny atmos-
phere. The central idea of the
physical features of the class-
room should be comfort. Since
fresh air is an enemy of tubercu-
losis the classroom should be well
ventilated. The best should be
made of whatever devices or
means of ventilation there is in
the classroom, even though it is
only the common one of opening
the windows from the top and
bottom. The temperature of the
room should be as well regulated
as possible whether the room be
in a modern steam-heated school
building or whether it be in a
one-room rural school, heated by
a small stove. The children should
be taught to cooperate in keeping
the classroom neat and clean.
There should be built into the
minds of all the pupils a general
concept of cleanliness, neatness,
and health which would follow
them outside the classroom as
well as in it. One could attempt
to create in all of them a love for
and interest in healthful, happy
living.

Some emphasis might be placed
on adhering to certain rules of
health. Some health rules which
might be posted in the classroom
as follows:

1. Never cough or sneeze into
another person's face. Use a
handkerchief or turn your head
away.
2. Do not spit on floors or
sidewalks.
3. Sit and stand erect.
4. Stand on both feet.
5. Practice deep breathing.
Breathe through the nose, keep-
ing the mouth closed.
6. Do not put fingers, money,
paper, or pencils into your
mouth.
7. Do not bite your finger-
nails.
8. Do not put into your mouth
fruit, candy, or chewing gum
used by another.
9. Wash your hands before
eating.
10. Do not borrow pencils
and pens. Have your own.
(Since children sometimes put
these into their mouth, they may
be carriers of disease.)
These rules might be explained
to the pupils, and the importance
of keeping them emphasized.
Special emphasis should be
placed on the rules regarding
posture. Pupils should never be

40 YEARS AGO—ETHIOPIA

Forty years ago at Aduwa
in Ethiopia, an Italian army was
defeated by King Menelik's brave
fighters.

Time was then when warfare
was different, poisonous gases,
tanks, machine guns and bomb-
ing planes were yet unknown and
soldiers met face to face and
hand to hand to test the courage
and skill of each other.

All thru the years since that
conflict, which was very short
lived, with the exception of tribal
wars, peace has reigned over
Ethiopia, so far as entangle-
ments with other countries are
concerned.

Today Ethiopia is again upon
the battlefields fighting against
the Same Nation who met de-
feat 40 years ago in an attempt
to invade Africa.

But alas, and with regret it
must be stated that over the pe-
riod of years that have elapsed,
Italy has been progressing along
military lines and has now an
army equipped with all the mod-
ern fares of war.

On the other hand, with but
slight exception, Ethiopia has
gone along with the years and
today finds herself with little to
defend Her Country against the
invader save the courage to do or
die.

It is lamentable that such
should be the case. Haile Selassie,
wise and brave little Ruler that
He is, should have the prayers
and sympathy of every Negro
man and woman throughout the
length and breadth of the broad
domains of America.

Let us pray, that God above,
Who doeth all things well, He
Who notes the fall of the little,
sparrow, He Who made and loves
all mankind, even the lowly sav-
age, will in His own wise way,
marshall the forces of right and
make victorious a people who are
greatly handicapped in their
struggle for independence.

the harm it does to their bodies,
and encourage them to sit and
stand erect at all times. Show-
ing the pupils a picture of the
lungs in a cramped position
might serve as a stimulus for
sitting and standing erect.

be given the pupils to follow out-
side the classroom and at home,
such as:
