Three of the faculty conduct half-day sessions; another teacher goes to a separate room for each one of her classes. Since the original construction of th school, only six frame rooms have been added to the main building.

The enrollment of the Rosewood school increased from 64 in 1931 to 202 in 1935. The old Wheatville school building, in a dilapidated condition itself, was moved across town and annexed to the Rosewood school structure.

Another old shack, located on public school property, was transported to provide a third room. The complete result is a makeshift building that is an insult to the Negro residents of Austin.
