297 State Banks Have 65 Million Lincoln-There were 297 solvent banks operating in Nebraska as of June 30, last, with total deposits of \$65,011,523 and gross assets amounting to \$76,138,979, as shown by the biennial report of the state banking department just printed for distribution.

This setup, following the long depression period and its heavy mortality among banking institutions, gives a favorable comparison with the same date in 1933, except that the number of banks in business is 118 fewer this year. Deposits were about 31 million dollars more in total last June than in the same month two years previously. The 1933 amount was

Loans and discounts fell off onethird during the biennial period. from \$39,484,721 in 1933 to \$26,-326,034 this year. Offseting this decline, the bonds and securities held by banks gained nearly 4 millions, from \$14,781,090 to \$18,317,-951, while general reserves increased over 10 millions, from \$16,165,-391 to \$26,375,281.
