Mrs. Esther White left Monday for her home in Muskogee, Okla., after visiting for several weeks with Mr. and Mrs. Bud Nevins.

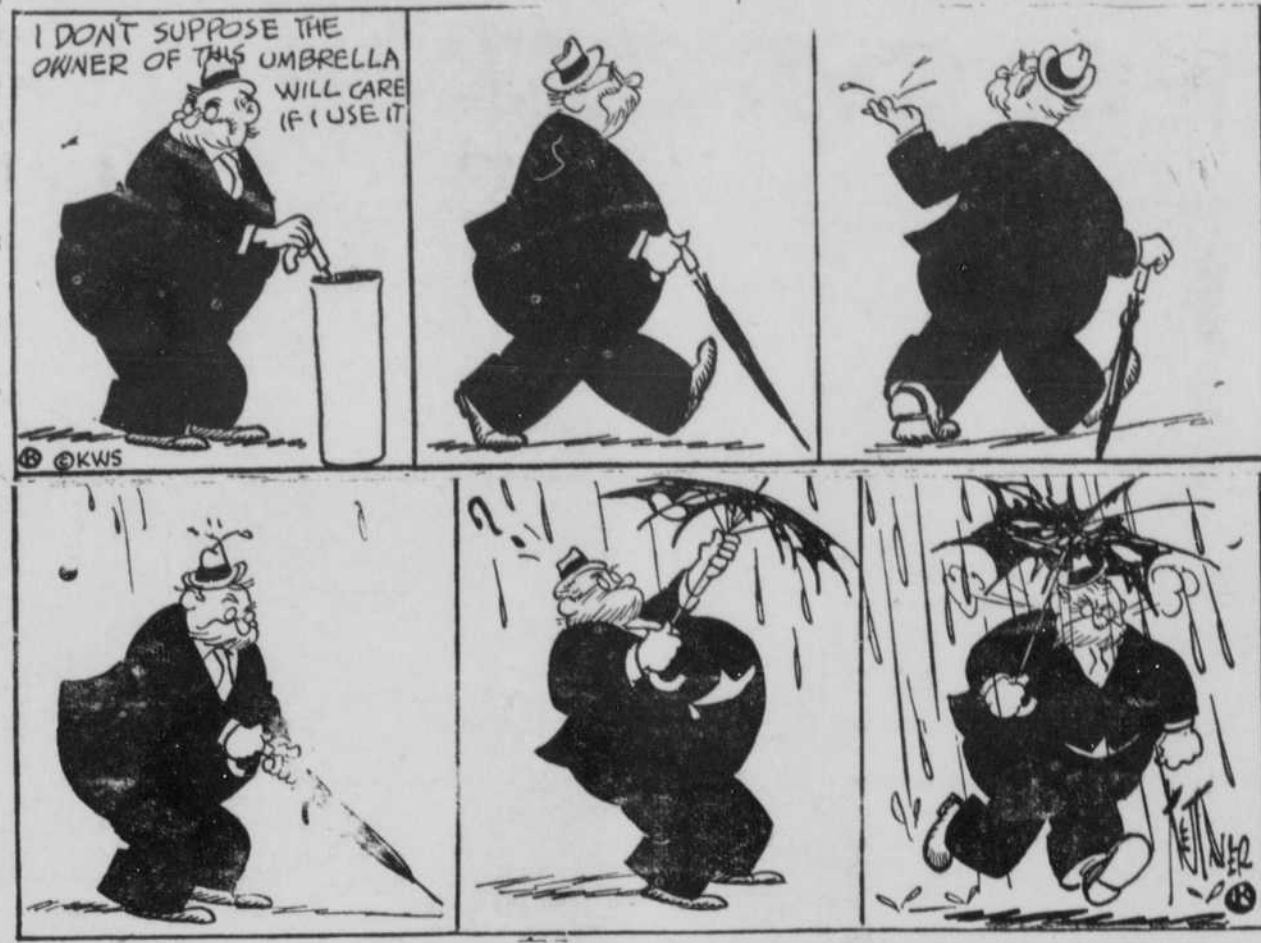
Little Val Jean Anderson, a grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Henry McCurry, who has been ill, is greatly improved.

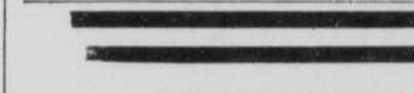
