Truck Driver Leaps Into Hudson River Saves Drowning Man

New York, Oct. 11 (ANP)—Kicking off his shoes and diving into the Hudson River from the ferryboat Tenafly, Wednesday afternoon, Willie Francis a truck driver, saved Henry Hodge from drowning. Poice say Hodge either "fell or jumped" from the ferryboat, and before Captain Thomas Harold checked the speed of the boat Francis was swimming to the drowning man and reached him as he was going down for the second time. Someone aboard the ferry tossed the men a life preserver which kept them afloat until they were picked up by the tug Thomas Tracy. Police ordered Hodge taken to Bellevue hospital psychopathic ward for examination and the Tenafly continued its trip to Edgewater, where Francis' truck and shoes were left in the ferry house. Both were claimed later by Francis after his clothing had dried. He suffered no ill effects from his heroic rescue.
