During the free silver craze, when the Western Republicans combined with the Southern Democrats to kill the Federal Election Bill...

Today, the Republican Party has shifted its position from the advocacy of strong federal government to that of defender of states rights...

The exchange of position of the two great parties on the issue of Federal authority versus state sovereignty is the most puzzling phenomenon in our political history.

The Democratic Party historically stood for local sovereignty as expounded by John C. Calhoun, the Negroes' arch enemy, and the premier defender of human slavery...

Although the Republican Party may prove recreant to its traditions, and to the eternal principles of human liberty, it cannot expect the Negro to follow in its recreancy.

Let us consider for a moment what the return of states rights would mean to the Negro today. The bulk of the race resides in the South whose white population has never accepted the intent and purpose of the 14th and 15th amendments...

Suppose for example, the question of relief were left to the Southern states. Does anyone believe that the Negro would get his just and equitable portion?

When the Negro wishes to secure an anti-lynching law, or relief from harsh discrimination in travel, or the right to serve on juries...

When the Negro voter goes to the polls on Nov. 3, let him ponder long and well before he casts his ballot for a candidate or party which now reverts to the doctrine of states rights which has been the source of his immemorial ills.
