St. Louis Registration Up Twenty Percent In Four Years

St. Louis, Dec. 12 (ANP)—While registration of white voters was rising only 8 per cent in the past four years, that of colored voters took a 20 per cent advance, according to figures released last week by the election board.

For the presidential campaign this year, there were 55,476 Negroes and 366,907 whites on the registration books as compared with 46,100 Negroes and 341,077 whites in 1932. Colored voters comprised 13 per cent of the city's entire voting strength.

Claude Bowers 'Shows His Colors' Again

Chicago, Dec. 12 (ANP)—Claude Bowers, a former newspaperman, author of "The Tragic Era," and present U. S. Ambassador to Spain, lived up to his reputation among colored people and again showed his colors recently when he left his summer home in the bombarded city of San Sebastian, taken over by the Spanish Fascist—and departed for a more neutral and safer zone. Bowers, book "The Tragic Era," written about the Reconstruction period of the south, shamelessly vilified Negroes and glorified the whites. It brought forth a great deal of comment from fair-minded Americans of both races who immediately placed him in the same category with Thomas Dixon, jr., and other of his clan who use Negro-baiting as their means of gaining public notice.

Ambassador Bowers, now a. w. o. l. in France or some other country, left stalwart Enic C. Wendelin, third secretary, in charge of the United States embassy in Madrid, who has ably directed the diplomatic work in the Spanish capital and care of endangered Americans in civil war torn Spain. Third Secretary Wendelin has done his job well, in contrast to his chief, who left the imperiled Americans from all sections of the country sincerely hope that deserved recognition for his patriotic service and fortitude and that the State Department will reward him with a permanent portfolio to Spain—preferably that to Mr. Bowers.

SOUTHERN TENANTS UNION SATISFIED WITH NEW GOVERNOR

Little Rock, Ark., Dec. 12 (ANP)—Satisfaction with Governor-Elect Carl E. Bailey's attitude toward the fundamental rights of tenant farmers to organize Tuesday was expressed by representatives of the Southern Tenant Farmers Union who Tuesday called on Bailey and held an hour's conference.

Those who took part included Gardner Jackson, chairman of the national committee on Social Rural Planning and Washington representative of the union; H. L. Mitchell, Memphis, executive secretary; Newell Fowler, Memphis, union attorney, and Howard Kester, organizer and member of the executive committee.

The union was particular desirous of learning Bailey's attitude because of last spring cotton choppers strike and charges of violence and terrorism against union members carried out by local and state officials, and the recent conviction of City Marshal Peacher of Earl on slavery charges.

Governor Visits At Prairie View College

Accra, Gold Coast, West Africa, Dec. 12 (ANP)—The sedition charge made by British officials against Ben Nnamdi Azikiwe, editor of the Morning Post, published here, has been postponed again. The charge against Editor Azikiwe who was educated in the United States, graduating from Lincoln university, Pa., where he also taught until three years ago, was the publishing of an article which state that Africans ought to select a new God. The actual writer, Wallace Johnson, was tried and found guilty and fined heavily. Azikiwe's case has been called sixteen times, the government taking an adjournment each time. It will be heard next on Dec. 16th.
