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**Radios Thanks For American Assistance**

New York, Dec. 19 (C)—For the first time in the history of broadcasting, an independent radio station in New York picked up by short wave from London and re-broadcast to America a message from the Old World of tremendous importance—the speech of Emperor Haile Selassie I, of Ethiopia who made a direct appeal to the American people to support Dr. Bayen, his personal representative, in the securing of aid for Ethiopian wounded and homeless, and for the continuance of the resistance of the Ethiopian people to imperialistic aggression.

The Emperor's speech, which was delivered in Amharis, the Ethiopian court language, was interpreted immediately afterwards by Dr. Bayen, who was in the studios of Station WHN atop Loew's State Theatre Building at Broadway and 46th street, surrounded by an interested and sympathetic group of supporters of Ethiopia.

The Emperor's voice came over the ether waves, across the turbulent North Atlantic, as "clear as a bell," and millions of American listeners were fascinated with the symphony of tones and sounds of a language not frequently heard, but which has a superior appeal to the ear than most foreign tongues.

Speaking immediately after the Emperor, Dr. Bayen translated the speech as follows:

"Hello America! We are indeed very happy to address all of Ethiopia's friends in the new world. We are told that 20,000,000 may listen to this talk. Then what better time than now to express to you the gratitude of all Ethiopians in this hour of great need and sorrow.

"We are told that all of America has a deep sympathy for Ethiopia, the cradle of humanity, and her people, and to them we would like that their interest in the situation has kept us alive to the issues at hand.

"We are indeed exceedingly happy that you have taken into your hearts Dr. Malaku E. Bayen, our ambassador of good will, who is now among you and whose voice you will hear immediately following this talk in translation. We are aware of every plan that Dr. Bayen is making, and we appreciate your support.

"It is our earnest prayer that the fate of Ethiopia has suffered will never be visited upon your shores, and that you will never know as a substitute for your democracy and freedom, oppression, persecution and extermination. May the blessings of God be ever upon you.

"Good night, Dr. Bayen! Good night, America!"

Dr. Bayen, whose plea of the American public for aid to Ethiopia is

being carried in many American newspapers, is in the United States on special mission to secure such help as the people of this country will give toward mitigating the suffering of the victims of the war of aggression perpetrated against an innocent people by Premier Mussolini of Italy. Whatever any individual or organization, club or social group can give to the cause, Dr. Bayen has said will highly appreciate. Dr. Bayen issues a duly signed and numbered receipt for every contribution of one dollar or more is given for an autographed portrait of the Emperor of Ethiopia, which is suitable for framing. The autograph is not printed on the photograph, but was actually signed with pen and ink by the Emperor himself in London just before Dr. Bayen left for America.
