White Plains, N. Y., Feb. '38 (ANP)—Mr. and Mrs. Joshua Cockburn may continue to occupy their \$20,000 English style house which they recently purchased in an exclusive district near here, decreed Supreme Court Justice Raymond E. Aldrich Tuesday in refusing to grant a temporary injunction sought by Mrs. Marion A. Ridgeway, white neighbor and widow of a physician.

The white woman sued to enforce a deed covenant which bars Negroes or any persons of Negro race or blood from owning or occupying homes in the section known as Edgemont Hill. This caused Arthur Garfield Hays, lawyer for the Cockburns, to raise the question of what legally constitutes a Negro, which is yet unanswered.
