The Musicians

America is in a dispute as to whether it (America) should accept the Indian music as native folk song or the Negro's spiritual.

John Lasker Howard (white) offers the following: "In 1634, Wm. Wood of England returned to London after being in America and hearing the Indian music. He likened their voice unto the warbling of a well known instrument. Woods also remarked: "Their music is lullabies to quiet their children, who generally are as quiet as if they had neither lungs nor spleen. Such command have they of their voice yet not comprehensive." But fifteen years before a Dutch vessel brought Negroes to America with soulful natural songs very understandable. There were no national Indian song for each tribe sang a different expression. Yet all Negroes sang the same thought, and too, one thing generally known, the Indian music carries a back ground of barba-tan rhythm named so after the African black man. Except Indians very few English speaking people understand Indian music or song but all English speaking nations understand and sing Negro music.

Howard says "The Negro songs are sincere because they are of Negro natures, and when a song reflects the nature of a people, it then is a folk song." "Noah and de Ark" type or the "Frankie and Johnny" song both are typical Negro experiences. Will America accept Negro or Indian music since it has none of its own? C scale is the foundational scale of all music, and is called the root of all music learning. A young Frenchman named Guy, afterwards called Guido D' Arezzo after the town where his monastery was located, invented the use of lines and spaces to indicate the relative pitch of notes, thus we have scales.
