Man Hit on Head With Heavy Rock; Lives

Columb'a, S. C., June 24 (ANP) - Two weeks ago when a rock the size of his head fell a distance of 90 feet, striking H. D. Hampton, quarry worker on the head while at work, physicians marveled that he lived long enough to be taken to the hospital. Last Friday Quarry-Hampton left Waverly hospital well on the way to recovery.

Physicians attribute his miraculous escape to the fact that Hampton was bending over when the rock struck, the result of the glancing blow being that the rock cut out a portion of his skull, doing the job as cleanly as though done by surgical instruments. Rushed to the hospital and X-rayed, the skull section knocked out was replaced. After the operation, asked if his head hurt, he said: "No it doesn't hurt, but it does feel kinda itchy." His attending physician, however, warned him against leaning over for some time, saying: "If you lean over, your brains might fall out on the ground."
