RECEIVES THIRD DEGREE



JOHN W. SIMS

John W. Sims of 2622 N. 25th street, son of Mrs. Lillie Simms Williams received his third degree from Creighton university this past June. He was the only Negro numbered among a class of 291 students. In June 1931, he received his first degree of Ph. C. (Pharmaceutical Chemist). In June 1936, he was awarded the degree B. S. Phar. (Bachelor Science in Pharmacy). Continuing his studies as a chemical analyst, the degree of B. S. C. (Bachelor Science in Chemistry) was conferred upon him in lieu of a Masters Degree which is not given in Pharmacy at Creighton university.

Born in Ellis County, Texas, John came to Omaha with his mother at the age of ten. Practically all of his education has been obtained in Omaha schools. He was graduated from Howard Kennedy and Omaha Central high in 1921 and 1925 respectively. After working for three years earning money to go to college, he entered Creighton as a freshman in September 1928.

The Closed Door
