Dedicate Cleveland Low Cost Housing Project July 18th

Cleveland, Ohio, July 15. (A. NP) — Dedication ceremonies for the Outhwaite (project) Homes will be held here Sunday, July 18, at 2:30 p. m. It is expected that a high government official from Washington, D. C., will be one of the principal speakers. Mayor Harold H. Burton, Ernest J. Bohn, Chairman of the City Council Housing Committee, Rev. W. H. McKinney, Leyton Carter, chairman Cleveland Housing Advisory Committee, Warren C. Campbell, Housing Manager; Gordon, Asst. Housing Manager; Rev. S. H. Sweeney, and Rev. M. F. Washington, will appear on the program.

Prior to the ceremonies, a parade will be held in which the Boydston American Legion, all lodges and temples of the Elks, Major John Fulton Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Major William T. Anderson Camp, of Spanish-American War Veterans, and the Army and Navy Union Garrison No. 236, together with bands and drum corps will participate.

A special band concert will be held in the Outhwaite Homes prior to the opening ceremony. The Gospel Choir of Shiloh Baptist church and Edward Tyler, noted baritone, will render special musical numbers.

It is planned to make the event of community-wide interest and thousands of visitors are expected at the project to inaugurate the new homes.
