Answers

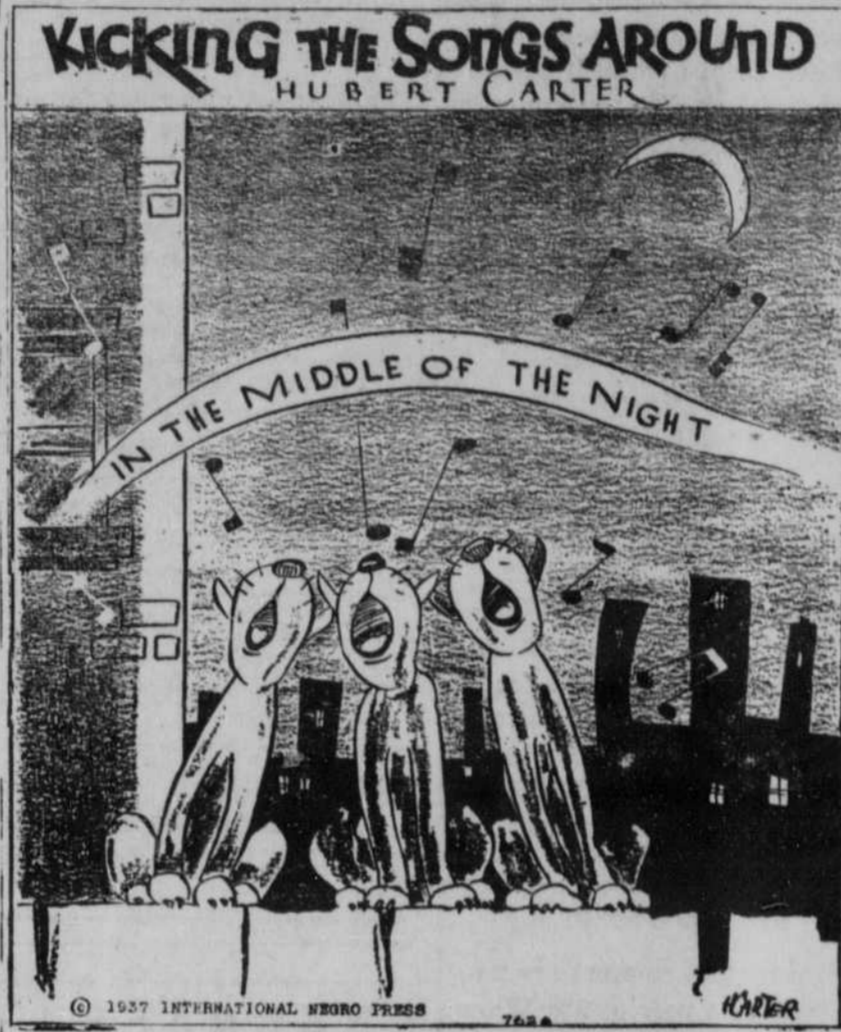
1. George W. Craver noted more than 200 products from the peanut, over one hundred products from the sweet potato and over sixty articles from the pecan.

3. In 1936, the Negro wife of Osceola, a Seminole chief of Indian-Negro descent, was seized as a slave. Osceola, in revenge, ambushed, killed and scalped U. S. General Thompson and three of his men. Thus began the second Seminole war.
