

Omaha Golfers Prepare for Tournament Aug. 15

16 Omahans Enter The Central States Meet at St. Paul

The biggest golfing event among midwestern players is scheduled for St. Paul, Minn. August 15th over the championship Keller course. Seven awards will be given to the winners of the three flights and medalist.

According to all advance notices this promises to be the classiest tournament ever undertaken in the Central States area.

Omaha Cornhuskers planning to compete in this tournament are: Penny Murray, Malcolm Scott, Jess Hutten, Boyd Galloway, Tom Chandler, Lonnie Thomas, Billy Davis, Dr. Craig Morris, Gaitha Pegg Sabert Hanger, Joe Owen, Harry Lewis, John Horton, Harvey Avant and others. Omahans ever growing fan section will be represented by twenty or more friends and relatives of the players who will take advantage of the vacation angle of the trip. The Cornhuskers players are drilling daily over Omaha and the neighboring courses in preparation for the big event in the hope that they can make up for the short coming in the two previous meets held at St. Louis and Des Moines. Galloway who finished third last year and Murray who won the meet several years ago are said to be shooting the best golf of their careers and should make their presence known next week when sectional players tee off for the 36 holes amateur tournament over the course which the St. Paul Open was recently held and won by Sam Snead. While these boys' scores will perhaps be a dozen or strokes higher for the 36 holes than the sharp shooting professionals, such efficient stroking on their part speak well for the Cornhuskers considering that they only play five months out of the year.

Lonnie Thomas, Jess Hutten, Mal Scott and Dr. Morris can be qualified as first flight players and any one of them is subject to get sufficiently hot to take some of the prize money. Billy Davis and Sabert Hanger both previous winners in other flights are certain to make their presence felt. On the whole Omaha with 16 players, should have a well balanced team capable of winning any or all of the flights. Boston, Aug. 6 (CNA)—Governor Charles F. Hurley this week refused a request by Georgia prison authorities for the extradition of James Cunningham, 37-year-old fugitive from a Georgia chain gang. The Massachusetts Governor said he had found "much evidence of brutality in connection with the punishment imposed" in Georgia. Cunningham was charged with escaping from a Georgia prison camp in 1924 while serving sentences aggregating thirty-four to seventy years for burglary and receiving stolen goods.

Henry Lewis After Shot at King Louis

Pittsburgh, Aug. 5 (Special to The Omaha Guide)—John Henry Lewis, rapidly outgrowing his light-heavyweight championship, plopped all of his legs into one basket today and began "hounding" Joe Louis for a heavyweight title fight. His signature on a contract which would guarantee the Bomber 450,000 thousand dollars to defend his crown in Pittsburgh, Lewis declared he was ready to forsake the 175-pound bracket he has headed since October 31, 1935.

John Henry sat alone, playing a of Natie Liff's training camp in the country Tuesday night, while Promoter Ellwood Rigby, Manager Gus Greenlee, attorneys and newspapermen discussed the possibility of a heavyweight championship fight in Pittsburgh. "I weight a little over 185 now," Lewis said, "and it's kind of hard to get down there. I'd give up the title for a chance at Louis. And

I'm going to hound Joe until I get it."

Then he signed the contract giving Rigby the right to match him within six months against Louis for 25 per cent of the gross gate after a guarantee of 450 thousand dollars had been counted out for the champion.

Manager Greenlee was confident. "I don't see how Louis can turn down that much money and we're willing to fight for nothing to get that title. I know my boy can beat him."

Lewis 23-year-old, began training today for a bout here August 18th with Italo Colonello, billed as the Italian heavyweight champion.

Mark Grave Harriet Tubman; Civil War Leader and Heroine

Auburn, N. Y., Aug. 6 (CNA)—White clubwomen have unveiled a monument marking the grave here of Harriet Tubman, revolutionary leader and heroine of the "underground railroad" of pre-Civil War days.

"Servant God, Well Done," reads the granite monument erected by the Empire State Federation of Women Clubs to the Maryland-born ex-slave who aided hundreds of runaway slaves in the flights toward freedom. She died here March 10, 1913.

Born in slavery, she was one of eleven children, upon whom, local historians record, rewards of \$40,000 "dead are alive" were once offered. For years she carried on her activities from this city, making frequent incursions into the South to guide parties of escaping slaves to freedom. The city became known as the center of the "underground railroad."

On her incursions into the South, Harriet Tubman always carried a loaded musket determined to defend herself to the death rather than be returned to slavery from which she had made a daring escape.

During the Civil War she acted as a scout for the Union armies, and was several times commended for her bravery and her valuable aid to the Federal forces.
