By day, he operated his own restaurant, the K. of P. cafe, sizzling those same lucious steaks but selling them at two-bits a teabone to colored cusomers. To be brief about it. Buggs had worked up a pretty good business until a squadron of city detectives swooped down on him late Saturday night and snatched a garbage can.

In that garbage can, the detectives found five dressed fat hens, several large juicy hams, lobsters, steaks, fish liver, butter, lard, eggs and a variety of canned goods, all definitely belonging to the Tampa Terrace hotel, but being transferred to the Bugg's K. of P. cafe.

Acting on complaint of the hotel management, Sergeant Morris and Detectives Keene and Hamilton stationed themselves at the hotel's service entrance. Shortly before midnight, the garbage truck backed up to the door and started loading The detectives noticed nothing unusual until the last garbage can was loaded. It was carefully placed to one side of the truck. Officers trailed the truck from the hotel to Bugg's establishment. There i stopped and Lewis Thomis, the garbage man hoisted that "last" can on his shoulder and took it into the cafe.

Beaumont, Tex., Aug. 12 (By John H. Thompson for ANP)-History was made here in Texas recently when for the first time a colored union labor delegate met with white delegates of the International Theatre and Stage Employees Union of Texas.

nearly a hundred whites, Lee A. Lewis, business agent for Loc. 279, a colored union of Houston, affilliated with the A. F. of L., was accepted freely and openly at this state convention.

Scheduled to be held at a local white hotel, the coming of Lewis caused the hotel management to denur at his presence. White delegates told the management that if Lewis could not enter the premises then they would take their meeting semewhere else. Lewis was admitted to the hotel convention room and was later seated at the banquet table with the whites.

Lewis is a member of the executive committee of the Houston local, composed of whites mostly. He is the man directly responsible for the strong fight put up by colored people of Houston to force employment of colored motion picture operators in exclusive Negro houses. Through his efforts twelve men are regularly employed at union rates.

Birmingham, Aug. 12 (ANP) --Funral services were held Monday at 16th SStreet Baptist church for Experience for Our Learning Thomas Cornelius Windham, reputedly the wealthiest Negro building contractor in the nation, who passed away Friday in his home after a lingering illness of three His health broke because he tax-

ed his strength trying to fill large building contracts in various parts of the country, contrary to advice of his physicians. He died one day before he would have celebrated his 66th birthday. For the past 40 years Mr. Wind-

ham had been known as the lead ing Negro building contractor in the country. He built the beautiful National Baptist Publishing house in Nashville which cost \$650,000. His firm built the magnificent Masonic Temple here at a cost of \$800,000, and he also superintendthe construction and completion of a \$1,000,000 building at Mulga, Ala. Mr. Windham also built the \$36,000 home of Dr. R. R. Moton, ex-president of Tuskegee,

Other edifices ereccted by Mr. Windham, who began building and contracting in Monroe, La., his birthplace, at the age of 17, were 16th Street Baptist church, \$150,-000; Alabama Penny Savings bank, \$150,000; Birmingham apartment houses, \$300,000; Gaudalupe college, Seguin, Tex., \$250,000; Bath houses,, Hot Springs, Tex., \$50,000; life from heaven; a daily portion Supreme Temple, Knights of Pythias, Chicago, \$350,000; and Masonic home, Rock Island, Ill., \$140,-

It was during the regime of President Moton that Mr. Windham built the beautiful new \$2,000,000 group buildings that now adorn the site of the great Alabama industrial school. It was also Dr. Moton who discovered the sterling business qualities of the Windham mind and solected him to carry out the Hailding plan which enables Tuskegee to claim possession of one of the most elaborate and and beautiful school quadrangles in

the entire country. Bradstreet and Dunn gave Mr. Windham an A-1 rating. He had large real estate holdings in Birmingham, Nashville, Chicago, and at several other places in Alabama
