

Jack Dempsey Don't Like Farr's Fighting Pose

Jack Dempsey, the ring's famed Manassa Mauler, after watching Tommy Farr go through his paces at Long Branch, N. J., last Tuesday remarked, "Farr looks all right, he seems to be able to take a punch but he carries his hands too low." Farr is looking better in training these last few days. He is receptively awkward and is a rough and bruising type of opponent. Abe Feldman, crack heavy-weight boxer, is the latest recruit to join Farr's sparring crew.

At Pompton Lakes, Joe is rapidly working into condition, never having ceased training since the Braddock championship go, the new champion is near his peak. When the Louis camp had been informed that the Welshman, Farr, was a rough and tumble fighter, butting purposes, they immediately adept in the use of his head for hired Marty Gallagher, Washington, D. Sixty thousand dollars have been paid for the exclusive motion picture and radio rights. The fight will be broadcast over a nationwide hook up.

Jacobs also snared another fight plum when the New York State Boxing Commission gave him permission to stage a fifteen round battle for the world's featherweight championship between Henry Armstrong and Petey Sarron. The bout will be staged at Madison Square Garden on October 29th.

Dave Almond, boxing promoter of Detroit closed with Billy Nelson, manager of "Tiger" Jack Fox, foremost contender for the light heavyweight honors, for his charge to meet either Joany Adamic or Roscoe Toles in the Flivver City late next month. Sixto Escobar world's bantam weight champion has been signed to fight Almond after he meets Harry Jaffra of Baltimore in defense of his title at the Polo Grounds, on September

FIGSKIN PRACTICE BEGINS AT K. C. ON SEPT. 13TH

The Knoxville College Bulldogs have only three more weeks to await the call for their first football practice for the 1937 season. Coach W. O. Hawkins, coach of the Bulldogs for nine years, and better known in grid circles as "Little Warrior," announced that the first call for practice will be Monday, September 13th.

The Bulldogs turned in one of their best records in several seasons last year. As the 1937 season approaches, with sixteen lettermen expected to return, and with the usual freshman crop, the K. C. eleven should be even more formidable. Two big cogs in the forward wall, Peter, southern guard, Harrison Dabney, were killed in a steel plant accident several weeks ago. The services of all three will be greatly missed on the gridiron this year, but Coach Hawkins hopes to be able to find three line men to plug those gaps.

John "Hunky" Horton, hardworking center from Chicago, will captain the '37 Bulldogs. "Hunky John" played a teller game at the pivot post last year warming the bench only three minutes during the entire season. On either side of the captain, at the guard positions will be Walker, Ward, Moore, and the hard hitting Dobbins from Cincinnati. At the tackle posts will be "Goon" Kidd of Knoxville, Russell of Toledo and "Hipcat" Parker of Cincy. Only two of the returning ends are lettermen—Crombie and L. Hill; but much will probably be heard from Capman, a junior, and "Zo" Duncan, the little end who gave the Tuskegee backs fits last year in the second half of their game here.

In the backfield will be last year's captain, "Sipper" Davis, halfback, a triple-threat man who has won the big blue "K" three consecutive years. At the quarterback position will be "Baldy" Madison, probably the most feared back in the K. C. lineup. Aljean Shelton, rightfully dubbed "The Cincinnati Express," another halfback, is due to hit his stride again. And with fullback Curtis "Shark" Wood, one of K. C.'s best defensive backs, in form again, Coach Hawkins has a backfield combination that packs plenty of punch and power. C. Wilson, A Hills, and Roach three speed demons, and "Bull" Christman are the other returning lettermen. Ramseur, halfback and dropkick specialist, is expected to come through this year, too.

GOLF ASSOCIATION RELEASES PROGRAM

Cleveland, Aug. 19 (INP)—The most ambitious golf program ever attempted by the United Golfers Association has been laid out by the chairman of the tournament committee, R. H. Hawkins, of Arlington Heights, Mass., an International Negro Press representative learned today. The tournament committee chairman announces that four golf championships will be contested for the Highland Country club in Cleveland, August 31st to September 3rd with some added events new to 'nationals' on the program.

As usual the big tournament will be the Annual Open of which this will be the twelfth playing. Starting with 18 holes August 31st, 18 holes will be played the following day with a 36 hole wind-up on September 2nd, making a total of 72 holes of medal play. A record breaking purse of \$500 has been provided for the professionals, with \$200 on the line for the winner of the Open and profession of the Open cup for a year. One hundred dollars goes to the second best professional and there will be eight additional cash prizes. Amateurs who compete in the Open and finish within the first ten will be given plate.

Just as important to the amateurs, as the Open, is scheduled 10th Annual Amateur championships for men. This event will start
