J. A. Rogers, well known author and Ethiopian war correspondent of 1845 Seventh avenue, New York City, has begun publication of a ulletin, known as "Gems of Negro History" which will appear weekly

Among its features will be a continuous story of the Negro from the dawn of time to the present in all the various lands as ancient India, Babylonia, Egypt, Greece, Rome, Africa and the countries of the New World. The history of the Afro_Amrican from his first arrival in 1513 to the present in the vari ous states will also be told continu
