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### The Guidite World of Music

#### Interesting Happening and Activities in the World of Music

The oldest organ, perhaps in all the world has been discovered at Acquicum, a former Roman settlement, now a suburb of Budapest. An attached tablet states that the instrument was made in 228 A. D. Its two wind chambers and fifty two pipes have been renovated, and it probably plays as well as ever. Strangely enough, one row of pipes was supplied with what are technically known as tuning rings, which modern organ builders have thought to be a recent invention.

Edwin Arthur Kraft has celebrated his thirtieth anniversary as organist of Trinity Cathedral of Cleveland, Ohio. On this occasion the musical organizations of the city united in paying homage to one who has contributed so much to the cultural life of the community.

Miss Emma Thursby, one of the most brilliant sopranos of the last quarter of the last century who died in 1931, is to have a memorial in the form of a music building for Moravian Seminary and college, Bethlehem, Pa., founded in 1742 as the first boarding school for girls in the American colleges and where Miss Thursby attended as a young student. The building is provided by a gift of \$125,000 from Miss Ina L. Thursby, sister of the great singer. Besides its school uses, it will serve as a civic center and a place of rehearsal for the famous Bach choir of Bethlehem.

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### At Boulder Dam

#### Summary

The driving of 110 tunnels and shafts, whose aggregate length is more than seven miles. Placing of sufficient concrete to build a walk five feet wide from the North to the South Poles.

Erection of 2,000,000 pound gates, 14 foot butter fly valves, 7 foot needle valves.

Furnishing of sufficient quantity of materials to form a train from the Dam to Kansas City, Mo., is by far the highest in the world.

Has a larger volume than the Great Pyramid.

Contains two miles of shafts and galleries. Was cooled to temperatures considerably below atmospheric while being built.

Fifty-two trucks, 150 passenger carry's a 29 mile railway system, a mess hall that served 6,500,000 meals, cableways of 25 ton capacity whose end towers traveled along the canyon rims, a cableway of transporting 200 ton loads. Is as high as a 34 story building. Contains two cylindrical gates, 32 feet in diameter.

Weights 88,000,000 pounds required 76 miles of welding rod in construction. Was exrayed at welded joints requiring 26 miles of film.

Has a maximum diameter of 30 feet 2 and three fourth inches thickness and a 24 foot length weighed as much as two steam locomotives.

Lake Mead filled to capacity will be 585 feet deep and 115 miles long. Will contain enough water to cover Connecticut 10 feet deep or to supply 5,000 gallons of water to every person in the world.
