Vote \$20,000 For New Oakwood Building

Battle Creek, Mich. Nov. 11 (ANP)—An appropriation of \$20,000 for the erection of a new administration building for the Oakwood Junior college of Huntsville, Ala., was voted by the Fall Council of Seventh-day Adventists in its recent session held here.

The estimated cost of this new building is \$30,000, \$10,000 of which has been subscribed by the World Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. The Union Conference of North America will appropriate another \$10,000. The constituency of the Oakwood Junior college will raise the other \$10,000 by public subscription. Nearly \$2,000 of Oakwood's share has already been raised.

Enlargement of the institution's facilities has been necessitated by the large enrollment. The school has the largest college enrollment in its history. Students are in attendance from nearly 30 states, as well as foreign countries.

Delegates to the Fall Council have come from all parts of the world. This is the annual gathering for the leaders in the world-wide work of Seventh-day Adventists to lay plans and to adopt the budget for the coming year. There were 25 colored delegates in attendance. Right: He came over to see me yesterday.

Wrong: I run across the street when I saw the policeman.

Right: I ran across the street when I saw the policeman.

Wrong: He begun the work yesterday.

Right: He began the work yesterday.

Wrong: He swum a mile.

Right: He swam a mile.

Wrong: The soloist sung two songs.

Right: The soloist sang two songs.

The words come, run, begun, swim, sung and many other words expressing action, are often used in correctly. These words must often be used with a helping word like has, have or had. There are many other such words not included in the list. You will find them with their three different forms in the dictionary.

All the words in column one should be used alone or with the helping words do, does, did, shall, will, may, can must, might, could should, would, to. All words in column two represent the past and never need a helping word. All the words in column three must be used with, has have had, etc.
