### The Guidite World of Music

By Miss Ethel Jones

Conductor Walter Damrosch

Of great interest is the life of Dr. Walter Damrosch, eminent conductor and musical educator of women? today.

Dr. Damrosch was born January 3, 1862 at Breslan, Prussia, the son of Dr. Leopold Damrosch, conductor and Wagner protagonist. He was musically educated under his father, Wilhelm Rischbeiter and Hans von Bulow, In 1871 he came to America with his father, on whose death in 1885 he became assistant conductor of the German opera company of New York, and musical director of the Oratoria Society and the symphonny society. Opera company for the production 1896 he gave the first American performance of "Parisfal" in concert form; and he has made such contributions to our national musical art. He received from Columbia university the degree of Doctor of Music in 1914; and from Princeton university the same degree in 1920. His opera, 'The Scarlet Letter," was produced by the Damrosch Opera company on February 10, 1896 in Boston, "Cyrano de Bergerac" had its world priemere by the Metropolitan Opera company on February 27, 1913; and "The Man Without a Country" by the same company, on May 12, 1937. Through his radio activities, Dr. Damrosch has added immensely to his services to American musical culture, to which he has been perhaps the most notable contributor.






