PULLMAN PORTERS DEFEND WAGES, HOUR AGREEMENT

Filipinos. No union can limit the employer's right to employ any type of worker. Moreover the Filipinos, like the Negro workers are under the Brotherhood jurisdiction and it is unwise and short-sighted for Negroes who are denied certain jobs themselves on account race, to discriminate against Filipinos on account of race or nationality.

"Some colored maids have been displaced by white hostesses because of an order from the railroads. Neither the Pullman company nor the Brotherhood had the power to retain colored maids. The railroads claim the public needs nurses more than maids. Of course the Brotherhood opposed it and is still fighting to reinstate the colored maids.

"The claim that miles above 11,000 under the Company Union were paid for 60 cents a mile and that porters are now working 14,000 miles without receiving extra pay, because of the 240-hour work month, is absurd. Since hours and not miles constitute the basis of pay, 14,000 miles are not significant. 240 hours a month represent eight hours a day, and after 240 hours have been made, overtime on a pro-rata basis is paid up to 260 hours, after which, overtime is paid as time and a half. If for instance, a porter puts in thirty hours of work in excess of 240, he will be paid the rate 40 cents for 20 hours of \$8, and then ten hours at the rate of time and a half, or 60 cents an hour which would be \$4.

"Now under the old system, 11,000 miles constituted the basis month, and would represent over 330 hours. But for this 11,000 miles a porter only received the basis monthly pay of \$88.50, the maximum rate for 15 years of service or more.

"Today, under the agreement negotiated by the Brotherhood, a porter who works 330 hours, or 90 hours above the 240 hour basis month, would receive \$50 in overtime pay, or \$8 for 20 hours up to 260, at the rate of 40 cents an hour, and \$42 for seventy hours of work above 260 hours, at the rate of time and a half or 60 cents an hour. And the maximum porters monthly wage today, as a result of the agreement, is \$11.50 and add to this \$50 for overtime, would give the porter \$150 for the month. Thus, it is apparent that the 240 hour basis month has, by far, greater earning value than the old 11,000 month."

Wright, an aviation official, had shot to death his beautiful wife and his best friend when he surprised them in a compromising position in his home. He had claimed a "white flame" took away his mind and he had killed unconsciously. Farley testified that everything got black when they started shoving me out of my own house, and when I came to I was standing there with the gun in my hand.

Will Probably Be Paroled

Although he was up for sentence for from 5 to 10 years on each count of manslaughter before Judge Bull last Wednesday, it is said the consensus of opinion that he will not have to serve out his full sentence. The fact that four ballots were necessary before the jury agreed upon the insanity verdict weighs heavily in his favor. The jury had also rejected the first degree murder charge upon which the prosecution had demanded that they send him to the lethal gas chamber, and several were required to find him guilty of manslaughter.

Unfortunately as the tragedy was, great good is expected to come of it to other, who are, like Farley in danger of losing their homes after toiling for years to pay for them. Since his troubles arose over \$29.66 street improvement bond that he was compelled to default, legal steps expected to be taken will prevent firms which make a score of pocket of buying up the defaulted assessments of the poor from so functioning. 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No Anti-Semitism Among Negroes, Says The Crisis

New York, June 9.—There is no wide-spread or deep-seated anti-Jewish feeling among Negroes, it is asserted editorially in the June issue of The Crisis magazine.

The editorial states that some Jewish leaders had become concerned over occasional speeches and actions which seem to indicate anti-semitism. After decrying racial hatred in any form in any people, the editorial states:

"But that does not mean that Negroes have not been puzzled and disturbed at time over the actions of some Jewish individuals and groups. In general in the trade union movement and in radical political organizations Negroes and Jews go along very well.

"Certain Jewish philanthropists hate made substantial contribution to the financing of programs for Negro advancement and improvement. But the Jewish middle class (upper and lower), the shopkeepers and merchants and the landlords, in many cases and in many localities, leave much to be desired. The story is still told in Harlem of the Jewish landlord who told his Negro tenants they ought to be glad to get an apartment with hardwood floors, tiled bathrooms and French doors at any rental.

"Currently, the 165,000 Negro citizens of Baltimore, Md., are incensed over the flat refusal of department stores in that city to serve them not ice cream sodas
