

Teachers Seeking Salaries Are Fired

Baltimore, Md., June 30.—The campaign for equalization of salaries paid Negro and white teachers in two counties resulted in the firing of at least four of them and the intimidation of many others, it was learned here this week.

The unequal salary scale in Maryland, which annually deprives Negro teachers of some \$486,000 has been called "wholly unconstitutional" by the best legal experts in the state, and his opinion has been forwarded by them to Governor Harry W. This opinion of the best lawyers and judges in his state led Governor Nice last year to announce that he would steps at once to have the legislature repeal the unequal salary scale and institute one salary scale for all teachers.
