

**BAR ASSOCIATION WILL HEAR JUDGE WATSON**

Fourteenth Annual Convention in Durham August 4-6 to Discuss Progress in Legal Profession.

Durham, N. C. July 15 —When the fourteenth annual convention of the National Bar Association meets here August 4-6 inclusive, it will hear in one principal address at the evening mass meeting August 4, Judge James S. Watson, of the Municipal Court of New York City. Judge Watson's subject will be "The Responsibilities of the Negro Lawyer to His People."

The other speaker at the Aug. 4 meeting will be the Honorable Harry McCallen, Attorney General of North Carolina.

The session will be held on the

campus of the North Carolina College for Negroes.

Scheduled for discussion during the day sessions of the convention are many topics touching upon problems in the legal profession. Among the discussion leaders will be Belford V. Lawson, jr., counsel for the New Negro Alliance of Washington, D. C., who won a decision on picketing before the United States Supreme Court; M. T. Van Hecke, dean of the law school of the University of North Carolina; Charles H. Houston, special counsel for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People; Richard E. Westbrook, Chicago, counsel for Congressman Arthur W. Mitchell in a jim-crow suit against the Rock Island railroads; Albert C. Gilbert, president of the Harlem Lawlers Association; Dr. Robert

C. Weaver, United States Housing Authority; Elsie Austin, assistant attorney general of the State of Ohio; Eunice H. Carter, assistant district attorney, New York City; and representatives of Howard, Terrel and Bent law schools.

The key-note address will be delivered by President William L. Houston, on the subject, "The Old Order Changeth."

**NEGRO LEGISLATORS HELP SAVE CRUISE BUSINESS**

Hamilton, Bermuda, July 20 (AP)—The two Negro members of the Bermudian legislature took an active part in directing the Passenger Ships Bill of 1938, which has just been put into effect here. These two members, John Cox and H. J. Tucker jr., supported the minority report on the measure which was of grave importance to business men here.

The majority report forced passengers on the many "cruise" ships which visit the island from the United States to discharge their passengers while in port. Such a policy would have required their occupying hotel rooms.

The Furness-Withy Steamship Line had already advised that it would house its passengers on board ship and protested against newer and more stringent regulations. The minority report restricted measures aimed at the cruise boats to a tax on bars and a head tax on all passengers staying on board. It was won by the margin of the two colored legislators' votes.
