Election Ups Is

As was expected, there was some political upsets on November 8th. In eight states, at this writing, the Republicans appear to have triumphed. In Pennsylvania the Democrats hold has been loosened; in Michigan, the Republicans have gained the governorship; and in Kansas, Ohio, Massachusetts, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Rhode Island, the Republicans have maintained leads which indicate victory.

The New Deal it appears is far from being generally accepted by the American electorate. President Roosevelt has wrought well, but as for making gigantic set-up a permanent governmental policy that remains to be finally decided.

Liberia

We hear warnings that Liberia is next to go in the gobbling up by the big fish of the little fish in the sea of stat-smanship. It is pointed out that Hitler has his eye on that country, along with former German colonies in Africa which he expects to bring under his control.

It is evident from the Munich agreement, that it Hitler wants Liberia, there won't be anything in his way to prevent his taking it. Uncle Sam, the godfather of the country, certainly wouldn't fight for the independence of the last free black state in Africa (we think) and Liberia is certainly not able to defend herself successfully against German aggression.

The Colleges
Prof. Randolph Edmonds of the Department of the Drama, Dillard University, New Orleans, writes on "Out-of-date Colleges" in the current Crisis. Prof. Edmonds says "Negro schools continue to train students for a life of 'Rugged individualism' instead of preparing them 'for a group world of mass production, trade unions, collective bargaining, and political

and economic centralizing."

There is merit in what Prof. Edmonds says, but our view is that he overlooks the controlling factors in Negro life in making his criticism. They admit, but they are controlled by others, and these controlling factors are the last to be loosened in a changing society. Negro leaders often have ideas for making their people better, stronger, greater, but these ideas may not be put into operation until "the time is ripe," and the time is never ripe until all other elements in the social scheme have moved up and it is necessary for the Negro to move up to keep from holding back progress.

"We have observed that there are ideas and practices in our life today that have made this a group world of totalitarian states and large economic blocs," writes Prof. Edmonds. We might suggest that these ideas are not yet accepted as the pattern for life in America. In all probability this question will be settled in 1949, when the New Deal, which represents the factory idea, as President Roosevelt outlined in his latest fireside chat, and the "American Plan" (individual initiative), which is still cherished by the Republican party, as in championed in all of Herbert Hoover's speeches, face each other in mortal combat. The Negro can do nothing definite about this in his own group until the issue is decisively settled by the American people as a whole.

MANICURE MUST SUIT SHAPE OF THE HANDS

Short Nails for Blunt Fingers
Look at your own hands. Instead, wear your nails rather short and rounded, and don't let them extend any farther than the tips of your fingers.
