tomteology even to think of sending another bunch of American men into a foreign country to war.

Typical of those opposed to the referendum were the words of Edwin M. Burr, editor of the Central City (Nebr.) "Nonpareil", who said "An inherent weakness of the democracies is their slowness of action.

Another is the necessarily unseasoned and often emotional judgment of the electorate—A further reason for opposition is the moral effect of tying Congress' hands—(the referendum) would be joyful news to the enemies of democracy."

Asked whether he thought his readers were of the same sentiment as he, W. E. Buckendorf, editor of the Rock County "Leader" (Bassett, Nebr.), answered, "Yes, I know it does, based on the usual percentage taken of polls of this nature. Many of my readers have voluntarily approached me on this subject and are very much in favor of a proposition of this kind."

Fifteen other editors who supported the referendum said they thought their readers also favored the proposal. One said he didn't know.

Of the seventeen editors opposed to the referendum, only four thought their views reflected the feeling of their readers. Five stated they thought their readers were for the measure, seven said they didn't know how their readers felt, and one believed his readers were equally divided on the question.
