Mr. Hummel cleaned up the ball diamond and playground at 20th and Burdette which was like a dump before. There will also be Rest Rooms installed if Mr. Hummel is re-elected. The colored people have never been denied a permit for the use of pavilions, parks or any other facilities in the Park Department under Mr. Hummel's term in office.
