

spoon vinegar; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 cup diced cucumber; 1 cup thinly sliced red radishes; 1 cup thinly sliced young onions. Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Add vinegar and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Chill until slightly thickened. Season vegetables with 1/2 teaspoon salt and fold into slightly thickened gelatin. Turn into individual molds. Chill until firm. Unmold on crisp
