#### NAACP. Resolutions Hit WPA Slashes

Richmond, Va. July 1/2-Opposition to the recent Congressional slashing of WPA funds, especially the Boderal theatre projects, as well as cuts in the NYA appropriations was expressed here last week by delegates to the thirtieth annual conference of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, in the passage of a group of resolutions that deplored the spread of anti-semitism here and abroad and urged a continued fight for passage of a federal anti-lynching bill.

Action on nearly a score of resolutions adopted at the final session of the seven day conference held here a the Fifth Street Baptist Church, evoked strong debate Saturday morning, July 1, when the vote on the resolution to amend the Wagner Act caused the most prolonged discussion.

The delegates voted to amend the act by including a clause which would deny the right of collective bargaining to labor unions that discriminate against Negroes. Opponents of the resolution declared that such an amendment would be the first step in crippling the labor movement as a whole and help materially efforts of the National Manufacturers Associtions and other reactionary groups to scuttle the Wagner Act.

Urging that Negroes and all "liberty-loving" Americans speak out against Jew baiting and the ressurection of the Ku Klux Klan, the delegates deplored the spread of anti-semitism here and abroad, and took a sympathetic stand for all oppressed minorities in other lands. The group took a stand against "entangling alliances" abroad however, while backing strongly every effort to preserve peace and keep America out of


