Weigle of the Yale Divinity school introduced Dr. Bethune as one of the great Negro women of America." It is probably the first time that a Negro woman has spoken in this chapel.

In her masterful way, Dr. Bethune spoke with reference to the contributions which Yale has made to American life and culture, and pointed out that in the critical times in which we live the Yale men have an even greater opportunity to help to create a real democracy in America. The audience was kept spellbound by the quiet dignity of the speaker and showered her with enthusiastic praise when the service was over.
