Now for Some Expert Advice



When a fellow needs a friend the printed word is often better than a personal boost. This upset Scout lost the first round but he's counting on Boys' Life, monthly magazine for all boys, published by the Boy Scouts of America, to get him on his feet and going again. The Boy Scout Movement actively promotes a program of good reading that capitalizes on every boy's desire for action, adventure, inspiration and achievement.

"In this year of 1939, the greatest single influence over the mind of man is still the printed word," declares Dr. James E. West, Chief Scout Executive of the Boy Scouts of America and Editor of Boy's Life, in rally the leaders of the country to the extension of the reading program of the Boy Scout Movement. These men, the largest group of volunteer workers with boys ever enlisted in the support of any social program, will in turn, as part of Boys' Life Week, in December, will urge parents to provide good books and magazines for their children.

"I have always felt it to be the duty of our Movement," Dr. West said in his message to Scout leaders "to give the boys of America the vital factors for character, growth and citizenship training that can be conveyed thru the printed page. It is my personal conviction that reading is an essential factor in the leisure time of almost all boys. Wholesome reading does, in a very definite and practical fashion, supplement the idealisms of the Boy Scout program.

Dr. West also recalled that the Boy Scouts of America has always been an active worker with the agencies and groups promoting better reading for boys and has demonstrated that books and Boys' Life magazine have long been a vital force for good, for enjoyment and for the kind of information every American boy should have. In addition to being the publisher of Boys' Life and several other periodicals equipped to help Scout leaders the Boy Scouts of America has produced a technical library of pamphlets in more than a hundred hobby and vocation fields and as many more pamphlets and books. The new famous "Handbook for Boys" has sold more than six million copies and is regarded by many people as a standard reference book in its field.

Librarians through the country report that boys of Scout age read more during that period than at any other time of their lives. The average boy will often read one, two or even three books a week if he can secure them. In addition to all the magazines he likes best. Scientific tests have shown that Boys' Life occupies a unique position in the publishing world. Less than a year ago a group of independent and impartial investigators addressed an

UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

As stated in articles herebefore printed, in order for an employee to get weekly workmen's Compensation benefits he must have had an accident at work and received a disability from the accident. Disabilities a person can receive from an accident may be generally put into three classifications, namely total and permanent disability, temporary total disability and permanent partial disability. Each of these disabilities are important enough to devote one article on them.

The phrase total and permanent disability is almost self explanatory. The word total means all or entirely. The word permanently means forever. The word disability means unable to work or do something. Therefore the phrase total and permanent disability means a workman who, by reason of an accident, has become entirely incapacitated from doing any kind of work.

When a workman becomes totally and permanent disabled by reason of an accident at work, his employer must pay him two thirds of his weekly wages not to exceed \$15.00 per week. In other words the most money a disabled workman can receive is \$15.00 per week. This is paid to him for a period of 300 weeks. At the end of the 300 week period, the workman then receives 45 per cent of his wages not to exceed \$10,000 per week for the rest of his life. In addition to this the employer must pay all of the doctor, hospital bills and medicine bills that the injured employee accumulates as a result of his accident and injury.

It will be noted that a workmen's compensation is based on a percentage of his wages. Occasionally we find a workman getting an exceptionally low wages are \$6.00 per week or less. In such cases where the wages are \$6.00 per week or less, then the injured workmen gets the full amount of his low weekly wage rate during the time set out in the law.

Next week's article will deal with workmen who have been injured, but the injury has only left them partial disability.
