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FIRST MONOGRAPHS ON STUDY OF CHICAGO NEGRO RELEASED

Chicago, Jan. 4 (ANP)—Horace R. Cayton, fellow of the Julius Rosenwald fund, and director of the Good Shephard Community Center, last week announced for the sponsor, the release of two monographs of a series which is in preparation on the study of the Negro community in Chicago.

The large study of the Negro community of which these monographs are a part was started in November, 1936, under the direction of W. Lloyd Warner of the University of Chicago, and Horace R. Cayton of the Works Progress Administration to study cultural and social factors surrounding the problems of juvenile delinquency of the Negro in Chicago. The study was financed and completely staffed through the WPA; and was sponsored by the Institute for Juvenile Research. After the project had been carried on for some months, it was decided that the situation presented an excellent opportunity to make an exhaustive study of a modern community, and a series of research projects deal-

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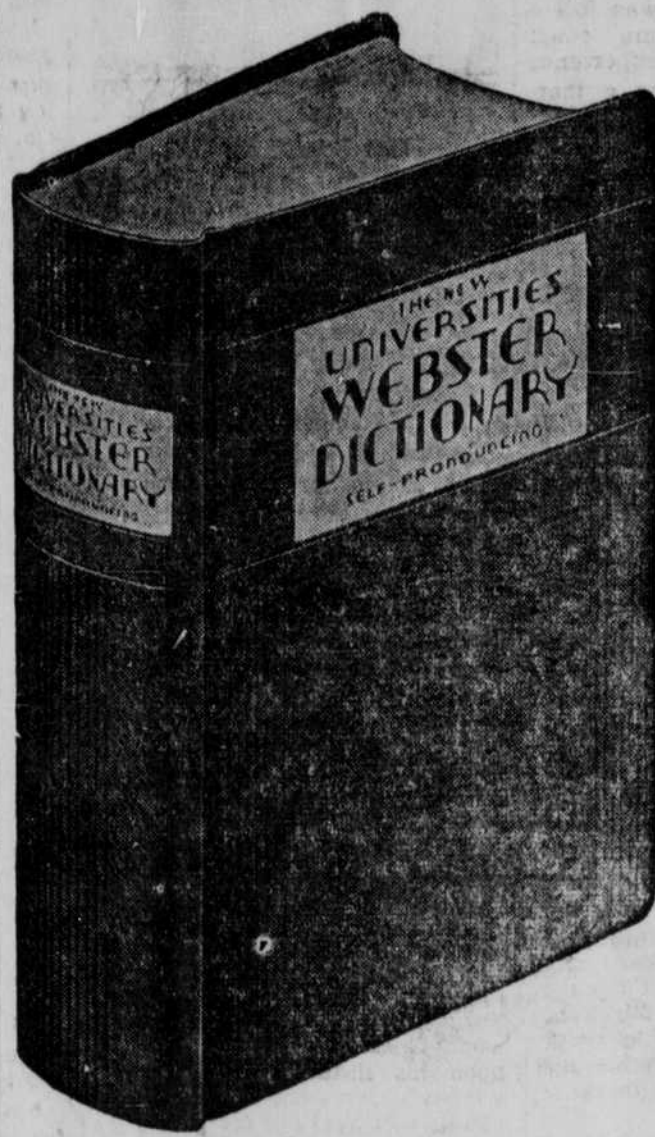
