Bahamas declare the title "Governor" is used generally for the ruler of a colony such as the Bahamas, but that the more impressive "Governor-General" is reserved for rulers of dominions, such as Canada, South Africa and Australia. In the West Indies area there are 11 British colonies with combined population of about 3 million. They include the Bahamas, Bermuda, Barbados, Jamaica, Trinidad, and Tobago. British Guiana, Windward and Leeward Islands, and British Honduras. Population of the Bahamas is about 68,000. Local residents however, said the job of unifying all the island groups is a particularly hard one, because each group has its own dialect, culture and customs, and many believe that real coordination of the various segments is next to impossible.

Mrs. Fausett Not To Quit

Philadelphia, Aug. 12 (ANP)—Mrs. Crystal Bird Fausett, who was the first Negro woman elected to a state legislature and later resigned to be assistant state director of the WPA, denied this week that she will quit WPA in order to direct a section of the Roosevelt Campaign. "With the Hatch act acting like a hatchet preventing persons on the federal payroll from political activity, rumors were rather consistent that the silver-tongued New Dealer would have to make a change. "I contemplate no change", she told the ANP this week. "When there is a change to be made, I'll see that the public knows it. However, I can say very frankly that I hope Mr. Roosevelt will be reelected because I feel that the best interests of the Negro race is tied up with the Democratic party."

Practice What You Preach

"Practice what you preach" is one of the guiding principles of the life of the St. Louis, Mo. hair dye manufacturer, Charles W. Godefroy, and Mr. Godefroy lives up to his precepts. For years this Negro benefactor has advocated that Negro employees in industry receive the same vacation grants accorded other workers. But Mr. Godefroy has done more than advocated this practice; he observes it. This year, as in past years, the Godefroy Manufacturing Company has its employees designate two as the company's "vacation period." During that period, all employees simultaneously take their vacations. Product manufacture is sufficiently geared during earlier months of the year to provide sufficient supplies for the vacation period. And this year, as in past years, all Negro members of the company participated in the general vacation period, with full pay.

25,000 World War Vets To Hold Reunion

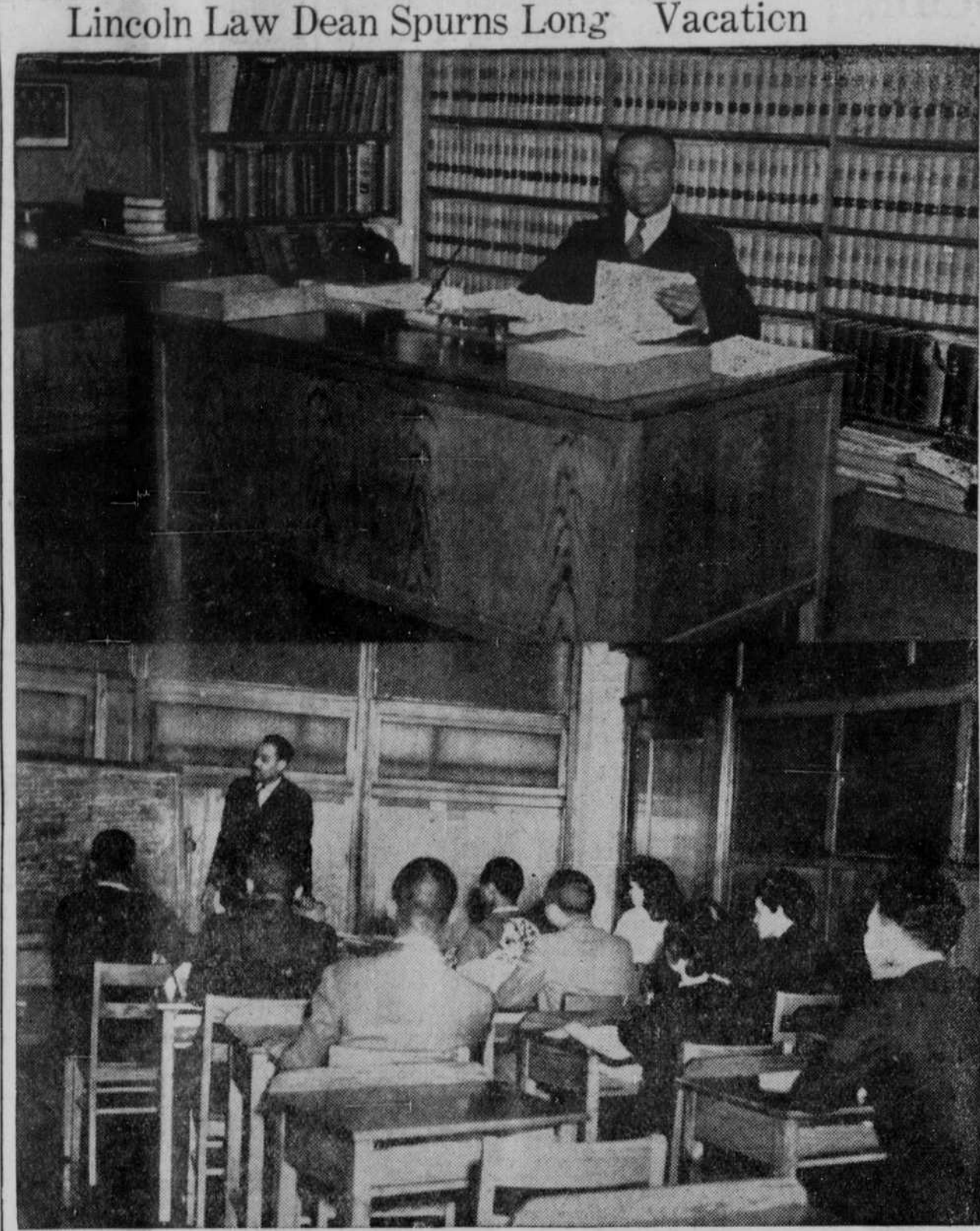
Jackson, Miss., Aug. 12 (ANP) A reunion of World War veterans will be held here Sept. 19 and 20 under auspices of the Afro-American World War Veterans of the United States, it was announced this week by the Rev. Frank Rodgers, commander in chief and W. M. Carter, adjutant-general. With approximately 25,000 colored World War veterans in Mississippi, the organization hopes that this reunion will be a means of inspiring a spirit of comradeship between themselves and a feeling of loyalty toward the constitution and the United States, Rev. Rodgers said. Topics to be discussed include "The President's National Defense Program and its Significance" and "The Fight Against Fifth Column Activities in the U. S. and Our Part in the Fight."

British Author Seeks American Negro's Aid For Selassie

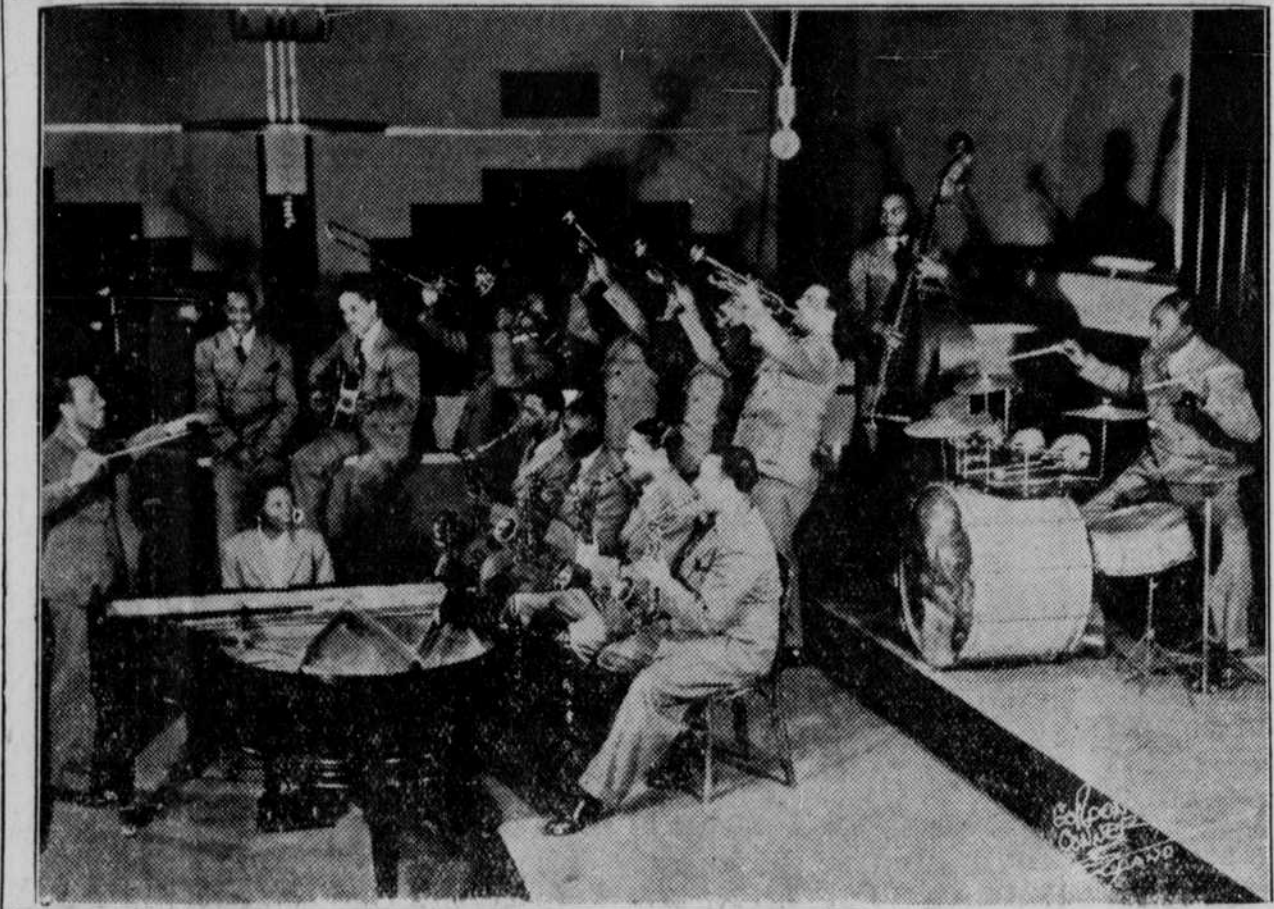
London, (C) In an effort to restore Haile ellassie, whom Britain has recognized as its rightful ruler, to the throne of Ethiopia, Sylvia Pankhurst British author revealed last week that she was seeking to arouse the American Negroes to a movement to overthrow the Italians in Ethiopia. She is asking for Negro fliers and funds which are Ethiopia's needs and claimed that American Negroes would be helping their own race as well as democracy in aiding Ethiopia, "by enabling great fighters to become active allies of Britain in the African campaign."
