Stars of CBS Forecast Show

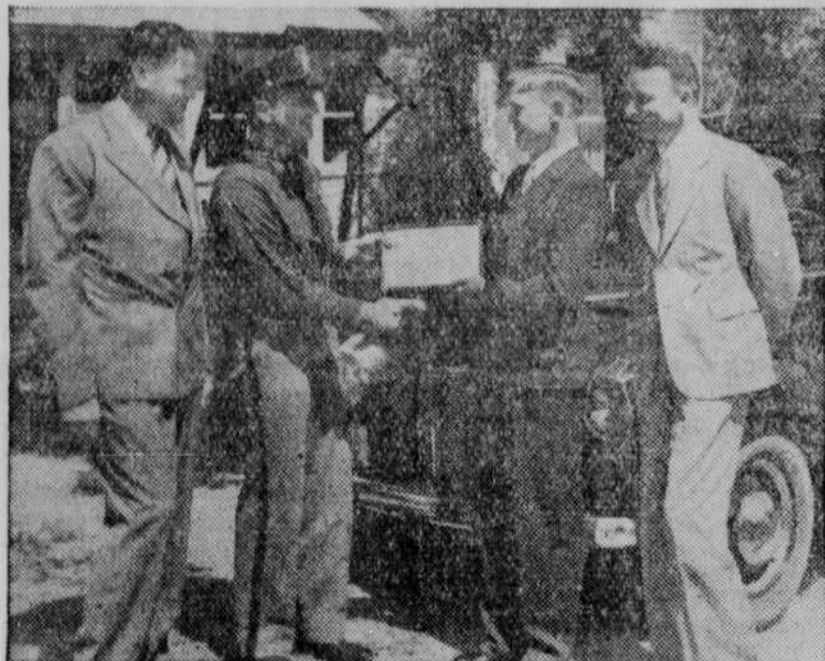

Spanning the entire entertainment and dramatic field from chor to comedy, four of America's greatest stars of stage, screen and radio were heard in a coast to coast Columbia net work presentation on Monday August 26. The production starred the great baritone Paul Robeson with Eddie Green, The Eva Jessye Choir and Amanda Randolph in the CBS Fore Cast series production entitled: "All God's Children". Music for the program was written by Earl Robinson whose "Ballad for Americans" became an overnight national hit when Robeson sang it over CBS last year. The music-directorial skill of Phil Cohan, a book and lyrics by John Whedon, and John Tucker Battle—plus the famous Mark Warnow orchestra, complete the line-up of stars. This Forecast program was one of a series being offered to Columbia network's millions of listeners. If chosen for sponsorship the same will be heard in a variety of programs built around legendary heroes especially suited to Robeson's talents.

Named Best Boy Driver in Nebraska



Jack Francisco, 16, of Royal, Neb., selected as champion good driver of his state in a contest conducted by the Ford Good Drivers League, being presented with the state winner's certificate by Corporal Woodruff of the state of Nebraska highway patrol, as R. M. Stoult (right), assistant manager of the Ford Motor Company's Omaha branch, and H. H. Hageman (left) assistant sales manager of Ford's Omaha branch, look on. The lad will compete for the national crown and a \$5,000 university scholarship with champion boy drivers from forty-seven other states in the finals of the good driving contest to be held at the New York World's Fair.

Royal, Nebraska, Aug. 29—Chosen from among hundreds of Nebraska teen-aged lads as the young man best able to drive an automobile safely and well and describe how he will attempt to reduce traffic accidents, Jack Francisco, 16 years old, of Royal, will represent his state in the national finals of the Ford Good Drivers League Contest to be staged in New York during the week of August 25th. Forty-eight young men, representing as many states, will take part in the final tests which will include a series of grueling car maneuvers in the traffic of New York city and suburbs, followed by psycho-physical reaction tests in the Ford building at the New York world's fair. The final examination, held under the direction of Dr. A. R. Lauer of Iowa State College, will rate the boys on their vital driving characteristics, including their reaction to road and traffic conditions. A \$5,000 university scholarship is the first prize.

The national champion good driver will be announced on Thursday night, August 29th, by Edsel Ford, president of the Ford Good Driver's League. The runner-up will receive a \$2,000 scholarship.

while scholarships amounting to \$500 each will be given to the three next best drivers. In addition, scholarships amounting to \$250 each will be presented to the next eight best contestants.

Each of the state winners, no matter what his final score, will receive a \$10 scholarship in addition to the cost of his trip with a friend or relative to the New York fair. The Nebraska winner comes from an agricultural community with a population of 217, where he lives with his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Francisco. The boy's father is a rural mail carrier as well as a farmer, and young Francisco learned to drive an automobile at an early age while working on the farm and for a storekeeper in Royal. In high school the boy is an outstanding student, takes part in athletics and plays the saxophone in the school orchestra.

Almost the entire population of the town turned out to bid farewell to the boy on his mother when they left for New York August 23rd.

Robert Luebs of Lincoln, runner up in the state contest, will receive a wristwatch in recognition

of his driving ability in addition to the certificate of merit awarded by the Ford Good Drivers League.

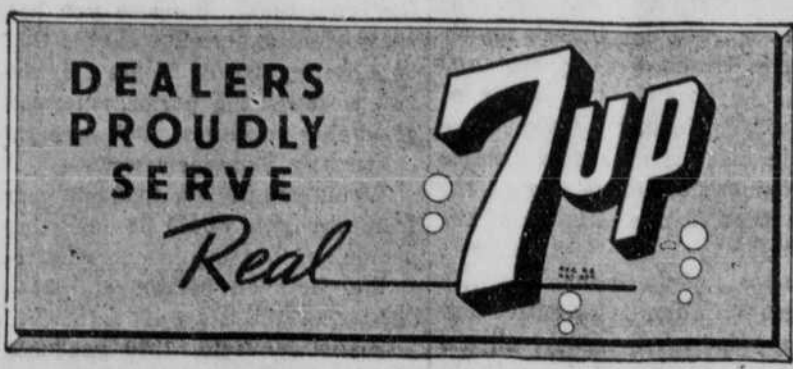
