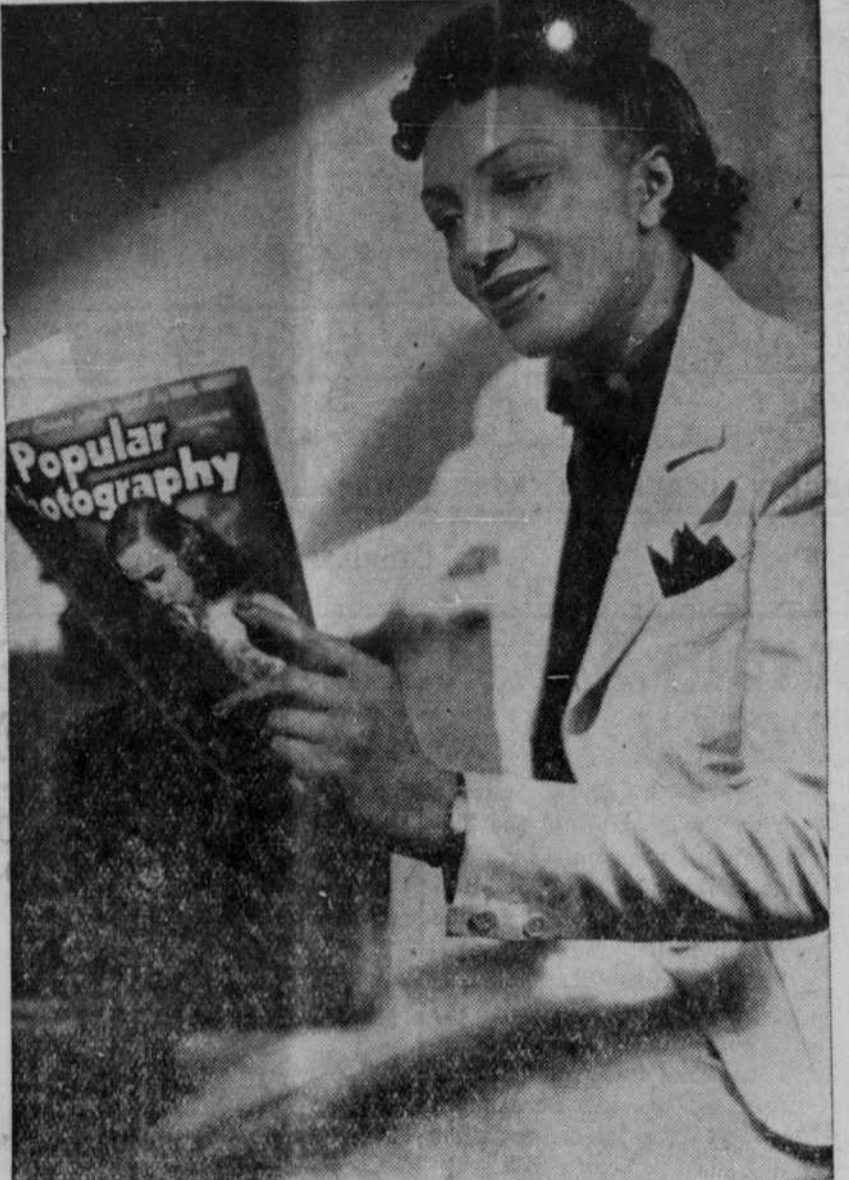

140 cash prizes totalling \$525.00 for pictures of Rural Youth, in addition to the first prize of \$500.00 for the best picture in the entire contest, are offered by YOUTH IN FOCUS, it was announced today at Contest Headquarters, 1775 Broadway, New York, N. Y.

In accepting an invitation to serve as one of the judges of YOUTH IN FOCUS, Mr. Roy E. HEALTH RESORT TO BE OPENED BY 'CRUSADERS' Hot Springs, Ark.—(SNS)—A nation-wide drive to save the former Woodmen of Union Building and properties was launched last Sunday morning in a radio broadcast by J. Andrew Patterson, president of the Knights of Inevincible Crusaders, the organization that has taken over the properties. The Woodmen Building which was once the meeting place and pride of Negro America seeking rest and enjoyment in the nation's greatest health resort, is now known as the Crusader Building, and plans are under way to open the hospital and bath house for the coming season. Patterson said that the Knights of Inevincible Crusaders, the organization that is redeeming the properties that were taken over by the Federal Government because of default of \$100,000 indebtedness more than six years ago, is a new kind of fraternal organization with an economic and industrial program.
