

WALTER B. TAYLOR BURIED WITH FULL MILITARY HONORS

Walter B. Taylor, resident of Omaha for 23 years died after a brief illness on Saturday, December 21, at 1105 South 13th Street. Mr. Taylor was born and raised in Spokane, Washington, attended public schools and studied medicine for 3 years and later was graduated from the University of

Washington. During the World War he enlisted in the army on October 16, 1917 and served with Machine Gun Battalion of Company A of the 349th. He soon rose to the rank of Sergeant Major and part of his army career was that of a Machine Gun instructor. He took part in the battle of Meuse, Argonne, St. Die and Marpache. On April 28, 1919 he was honorably discharged from the United States Army where his record was not only a credit to himself but to his race as well.

In later years Mr. Taylor was employed by the Union Pacific as chef cook, and he was also in charge of Private car No. 116. In recent years he had worked at lo-

cal hotels. He is survived by a daughter, Marcia of Omaha and a brother, Clarence of Spokane, Washington. Funeral services were held Monday afternoon, Dec. 30th from Thomas Mortuary with the Rev. G. D. Hancock, minister of

Selective Service advisors on psychiatry will meet in Washington, D. C., on January 2 and 3 for the first regional conference intended to bring about greater uniformity in fixing mental qualifications of selectees, National Headquarters, Selective Service System announced today.

C. A. Dykstra, director of Selective Service, said: "This is the first great collective effort of the Nation's experts to establish minimum mental standards for men to be inducted into our armed forces. A team of instructors, consisting of a psychia-

Director Dykstra will open the first session, which will be devoted mainly to a general discussion of psychiatry and the need for applying its principles to the selectees.

Brig. Gen. Lewis B. Hershey, deputy director of Selective Service, will preside at the evening session on Thursday, 8:30 o'clock, January 2. At the same session, Paul V. McNutt, Federal Security Administrator and Coordinator of Health Welfare and Related Defense Activities, will speak on "What We Expect of Psychiatry in This National Defense Program" and Dr. James Stuart Plant, director of the Essex County Juvenile Clinic, will discuss "The Psychiatric Challenge in Selective Service."

The day sessions will hear such prominent medical men as Dr. Lewellys Barker, internationally famous former chief of Medicine at Johns Hopkins; Lieut. Col. William C. Porter, M. C., USA; Dr. Martin Cooley, Veterans' Administration; Dr. Harry Stack Sullivan, of the William Alanson White Psychiatric Foundation; Dr. Roscoe W. Hall, clinical director of St. Elizabeth's; Dr. Alexander Simon, senior medical officer of St. Elizabeths; Dr. Lauren Smith, physician in chief, Pennsylvania Institute; Dr. Spafford Acklerley, University of Louisville, School of Medicine; Dr. Dexter M. Bullard, Chestnut Lodge Sanitarium. Dr. Winfred Overholser, superintendent of St. Elizabeths Hospital. Director Dykstra emphasized
