"I met him at Saint John's Baptist Church where I had been attending. Often he would follow me to the car-line as I started for home. He would call me on the phone, but I would refuse to talk to him. He had made threats but I did not pay any attention to them, thinking that he did not mean them. His attentions became so annoying that I left that church in order to avoid him. Somehow he found where I lived and on Saturday night he called me on the phone. I had told Mrs. Rogers, (with whom I stayed) that when any man called me that I did not want to talk with him. When he called I refused to talk to him."
