ATTENTION BOARD OF DIRECTORS NAACP more, they must be consulted before action is taken which may well spell injury to the crusade which you lead.

The Omaha Guide, therefore, suggests that in the case of William Pickens, a referendum vote of the Branches be had before any action is taken in the case by your body.

More than thirty years have passed since the organization was formed. It was, at first, by necessity, a centralized body, supreme power being placed in the Board of Directors. Because it was engaged in a fight for civil liberty and local branches might be subject to irresistible pressure in backward communities, justification may be pleaded. Moreover, we had not learned in those early years how to fight efficiently under the forms of law. These latter things we have learned. But it is now necessary to provide for a larger participation of the membership in important decisions where many members feel vital interests of the association itself may be affected or even decided.

The Editor has been active in the Association ever since it was formed. He believes in its principles and is proud of its accomplishments. He seeks only to strengthen it for the fight which lies ahead.

Two Negro lawyers, McGill of Jacksonville, Florida and Ransom of Washington, D. C. conducted the defense from the beginning to the end of this case. The value of this accomplishment should not be lost on the Colored People.



The Negro citizens of Lincoln are still in a progressive mood, Mr. T. Woods Secretary of the Urban League of Lincoln assisted by Rev. Trago T. McWilliams has arranged for a State Wide Urban League Conference, to be held here in Lincoln in the new \$30,000 Urban League building for one day, which will be Saturday, March 28th. The location is 2030 S St.

The purpose of the meeting is to study interracial social actions and Nebraska Negroes participation in war and post war programs. There will be delegates from Aurora, Falls City, Wahoo, Beatrice, Grand Island, Hastings, Columbus, North Platte, Fremont, Schuyler, Scotts bluffs, Alliance, Nebraska City an Omaha.

It is hoped that as many of our race as well can attend this meeting. Mr. M. T. Woods has been called to Kansas City to an Urban League meeting, where there were ten middle western leagues represented. Mr. Woods will open the discussion on Negro participation in protective and morale services of the Civilian Defense program. The conference theme will be Negro employment in war and victory program.

The Urban League Executive Advisory Committee met Tuesday evening. Rev. O. J. Burckhardt is president, Clayton Lewis, Secy. Some very important measures were discussed which pertain to signs of discrimination shown on the part of some of those who are in charge of defense projects. Those present at said meeting were Rev. Budckhardt and wife.

The young people of Quinn Chapel last Sunday evening had a Panel discussion. The subject was Why Should the American Negro Soldier Fight in this War? Those Miss Eugene Simms, Raylee Lewis presided over the meeting. This was the main event of the Young Peoples meeting.
