

Ears at right illustrate production of resistant "G" Hybrids grown under same conditions in southeastern Pennsylvania. Studies are being made there now so that resistant strains may be developed before Japanese Beetles get to the central corn belt. Entomologists believe Japanese Beetles will be serious pests in the middle west in years to come. 
