SEND TO HAVE MANY NEGRO OFFICERS

Washington, Sept. 3 (ANP) Discussing the activation of the 92nd division scheduled for October at Camp McClelland, near Aniston, Ala., Secretary of War Stimson told his press conference Thursday morning that officers for the triangular unit would be for the most part colored. They were being trained now, he said, to take over the posts and from the experiences with colored officers in other units, they were proving highly satisfactory. He spoke of the training of officers in the various schools and colleges of the country and said the men were being graduated as rapidly as possible.

This division is a reconstituted World War I division, the old 92nd being recruited from Negro selective servicemen from the United States at large at Camp Funston, Kansas, in October, 1917.

FEDERAL GRAND JURY TO INVESTIGATE ARKANSAS DEMOCRATIC PRIMARIES

Fort Smith, Ark., Sept. 4—Last Monday U. S. District Judge John E. Miller charged a federal grand jury from the West Arkansas district to investigate reports of alleged fraud and civil rights violations directed against Negroes at the July 28 and Aug. 11 Arkansas Democratic primaries.

Judge Miller acted at the request of Atty. Gen. Biddle, who said the probe was state-wide in scope and came as a result of secret investigations during the past several weeks made by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Rock, through U. S. District Atty. Sam Rorex of the Eastern Arkansas District. Atty. Gen. Biddle said the charges involved numerous instances of alleged irregularities in the use of poll tax receipts, counting of ballots and denial of voting privileges to qualified Negro voters.

DR. MCCARROLL TELLS BUSINESS WOMEN NEED FOR PLANNED FAMILIES

Chicago, Sept. 1 (ANP) Speaking before the National Negro Housewives' league in session during the business league meeting here last week, Dr. E. Mae McCarroll, brilliant young Negro physician, now serving as acting-medical consultant for the Planned Parenthood federation, told the assemblage.

"Negro business men and women know that race stabilization and progressive order depend upon a production, health, culture and social position relationship between real ideals. Planned parenthood is one of the most important factors in attaining this goal. Scientific knowledge necessary for child spacing is available to those who are able to go to private doctors but is not equally available to poorer people.

"The death rate for Negro mothers is 50 percent higher than that of white mothers and 34 percent higher than the national average. The sickness rate is 43 percent greater, the length of life is 12 years shorter. Negro mothers die twice the rate of white mothers; Negro babies die at 1 1/2 times the rate of white babies; Negro children show a 50 percent higher death rate.

"When in 1934 the children's bureau of the labor department published a report comparing the maternal death rate of our country with that of 16 other countries and it was revealed that our country's death rate was higher. America got busy and did something about it. When in 1935 South Carolina found herself in the unpleasant position of having the highest maternal mortality of any state in the union, South Carolina did something about that and achieved a substantial reduction.

"The Negro maternal death rate mortality rate is 90 per 10,000 live births, that of white women is 44 per 10,000 live births. What are we going to do about it? We know that 25 percent of our maternal deaths occur in women with diseases which contraindicate pregnancy. Family planning can prevent these.

It can prevent much invalidism and chronic sickness in women produced by too frequent pregnancies, it can reduce the blighting effects of poverty by keeping the size of the family in keeping with the family income, it can reduce infant mortality by enabling mothers to space their children at two or three year intervals, it can reduce the spread of venereal and other diseases by making it possible for parents with transmissible diseases to avoid having children until they are cured."

RED CROSS SERVICE CLUBS OPEN TO ALL SOLDIERS DAVIS TELLS NAACP

New York—"All of the service clubs and recreation centers established by the American Red Cross in England are for the use of all United States Service men including Negroes," Norman H. Davis, chairman of the American Red Cross told the NAACP on August 24.

The NAACP had vigorously demanded to know if reports that Jim Crowism recreation centers would be set up in England were true. The Red Cross stated that "the Army itself has units composed entirely of Negroes," and added that for the convenience of these units the Red Cross is establishing "with the approval of the commanding officers," a recreational club in London, but the privileges of this club will also be extended to all service men.

The NAACP answered Davis stating, in effect, that that was all very well, but because of its experience

FBI PROBES FATAL BLAST IN BIRMINGHAM SCRAP METAL YARD

Birmingham, Sept. 4 (ANP) Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation are seeking the cause of a mysterious explosion which last week caused the death of two Negroes, employed by M. Kimerling and Sons scrap metal company here.

According to reports of the disaster, Dixon Lanier was killed instantly, and Buster Brown, another worker, died as he was being taken to Jefferson hospital. The explosion occurred while the men were cutting some bales of copper wire with a machine.

Neighboring residents declared the blast was so strong that it shook the surrounding area and mutilated the bodies of the victims... blowing the clothing of one of the men more than 100 feet from the machine. The explosion, first of its kind there, occurred in the yard did no damage to the plant. Coroner G. M. Evans made a preliminary investigation before referring his information to the FBI.

ANOTHER TO PHI DELTA KAPPA

Denver, Sept. 3 (ANP)—Gilbert Cruter, a candidate for the master's degree in physical education at Colorado university here, last week was initiated in to Phi Delta Kappa national honorary educational fraternity which until recently had its doors closed to Negroes.

The fraternity, which has a membership of over 25,000 has as its chief aim the promotion of free public education as an essential to the "development and maintenance of a democracy through the continuing interpretation of the ideals of research and leadership."

Cruter, who is doing some special research work on the Negro and recreation, is a teacher and coach at Southern university, Scotlandville, La. A former high jumping star he is a member of an AAU team which toured Europe. Married, his wife, also a teacher at Southern, is
