the human system the craving for economic advantage. It is such things as these that make inevitable the prediction that for centuries yet to come the nations are going to be afflicted by wars and rumors of wars. Jesus Christ went to the heart of the matter when he said that mankind must have first of all a change of heart before there can be a change of human fortunes. The peace we humans seek grows out of a peaceful and brotherly heart. We are trying to have peace without brotherliness and it simply cannot be done. As I said in my Baptist World Alliance address in Atlanta a few months ago, "this world must be brotherized or it will be brutalized". It cannot be brotherized so long as there is the notion of race superiority among the nations of the earth.

It is well that we understand that behind all that Hitler is doing is the notion that the German race should rule by reason of its superiority. What is more, our own country is facing a two ocean war. Our problem would be considerably simplified if we had Japan for an ally instead of enemy. But it is a matter of record that only a few years ago we flaunted into Japan's face the dictum that darker peoples were inferior and that she as one of these darker peoples was to be denied equality under our immigration laws. Japan of all the nations was dis-

criminated against on the grounds that she was inferior. It is hard to see where Japan can be blamed for forming an alliance with Hitler if such alliance promises more than our pretended friendship. It is one of the most appalling prospects that we are being forced to defend ourselves against a nation whose good will today would mean perhaps the difference between victory and defeat in a war for national existence. But our vaunted notions of race superiority crucified one of this nation's most vital opportunities.

If Hitler wins the battle of the Atlantic he will win it by reason of our being too busy with Japan in the Pacific. The tragedy of war! The greater tragedy of war based upon an ideology which has no scientific standing. Let us not forget the diagnosis while bewailing the symptoms of war. This is but the beginning of sorrows that racism is bringing upon the earth.
