

U. S. INDICTS TWO ST. LOUIS MEN FORSEDITION;

Butler and Erwin are also accused of directing members to evade requirements of the selective service law by filling out a blank form and paying a small fee which entitled them to certificates as ministers without regard to their qualifications.

This charge is the basis of a second count in the indictment alleging interference with operation of the draft act. Maximum penalty upon conviction would be two years in prison and a fine of \$10,000.

Erwin was arrested in his home here and confined to city jail to await arraignment before the United States commissioner. He asserted that he had been recently re-elected to the presidency of the Pacific movement but had not yet been inducted into office. The prisoner was vehement in his denial that he had Japanese alliances or had engaged in subversive activities.

Police took Butler into custody at his home in East St. Louis and he likewise categorically denied the government's charges. He said he had resigned from the presidency because of a quarrel with other members, and emphasized that he had no love for the Japanese.

Bond for both was fixed at \$5,000.

Atty Gen. Francis Biddle who made announcement of the indictment at Washington said that attempts of Japanese agents to "in-

filtrate" Negro organizations had been repudiated by responsible leadership. He said that many of the members of the movement had been duped and were unaware of Japanese sponsorship.

The organization was founded in St. Louis in 1932 by Ashima Takis, a tool of the Japanese Black Dragon society supervised by Satohashi Takahashi, a retired Japanese army officer. The organization is said to have stretched from Philadelphia to Phoenix with Takis claiming 165,000 members.

Takis was sentenced last fall to serve three years in a federal prison for forgery of a United States postal money order.
