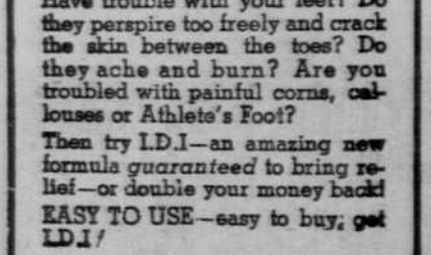

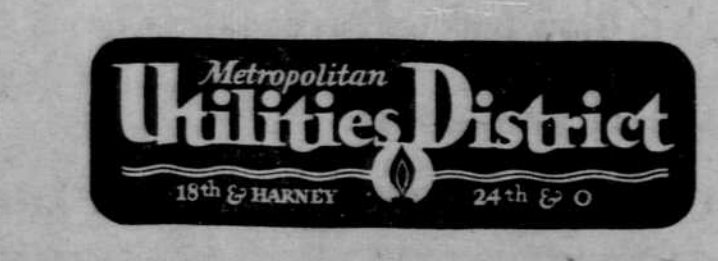
Mr. and Mrs. Kings Aljs attended morning service at Clair Chapel on Sunday, March 28th.

NY PHILHARMONIC SYMPHONY GIVES NEGROID WORK FIRST PERFORMANCE (BY CARL DITON)

New York, April 2 (ANP) In accordance with its policy to encourage musical composition in the Negro vein, the New York Philharmonic Symphony offered Sunday afternoon a first performance of "Batouque" from the "Rejoso de Pastorelo" suite of the talented Brazilian composer, Oscar Lorenzo Fernandez. This constructive work of no mean importance since serious, Negroid musical creation, we hope, has in no wise reached its culmination in development, a fact that should be of great comfort to interested composers, especially those of Negro descent.

There is not much that can be said of the work except that the composer has approached his task with seriousness. It had, of necessity, to be brief in order to successfully portray what was originally and African dance calling forth the utmost exertion of body and feet, reaching at times to the point of violence. There was notably a pretty little motive savoring much of the ancient Greek scale which the composer used frequently a la "estimate."
