ANNOUNCE RECRUITMENT OF
10,000 NEGRO MARINES

With one unit of Negro marines
already assigned to overseas duty
and others being trained in artil-
lery, anti-aircraft, communications
and other fields, Marine Corps
Headquarters announced plans for
recruitment of 10,000 Negroes.

Approximately 2,000 Negro Mar-
ines are now being trained in the
51st Composite Defense Battalion
at Montford Point, Camp Lejeune—
mammoth Marine Training Reser-
vation at New River, N. C.—and
new recruits are arriving at the
rate of 40 a day.

Breaking a tradition of 167 years
the Marine Corps began the enlist-
ment of Negroes on June 1, 1942.
Three months later, the first group
of 1,200 volunteers from all sec-
tions of the country began their
training at the 200 square mile
North Carolina camp which had
been constructed at a cost of \$69,
000,000.

LOOKING AROUND IN HARLEM

NEW YORK—The Savoy Ballroom is dark and may remain so. The "Home of Happy Feet" where millions thronged during its 17 years of existence as a landmark of Harlem and of New York City is now on the inactive list because of board of health, police and army action in taking steps to protect the men in our armed forces. The NAACP and other organizations have taken up the fight to get it opened again, but from this corner such efforts appear futile since it has been in the cards for a long time that the Lenox Avenue rendezvous of jitterbuggers was doomed.

Some claim the mixing of the clientele—Negro men dancing with white women—was the real reason why the Savoy is closed. There are others who contend that the carelessness of the management in allowing certain situations to exist is responsible. In this instance, it is believed that the employees of the Savoy, the doormen, the bouncers, the waiters, countermen, ticket sellers, manager and assistant manager from long experience could come to know certain types of patrons. They were believed to have been smart enough to recognize a "bad egg" among the many women who appeared at the place every time the doors were opened. It was their duty to see that such people didn't get in.

The mixing of the races at the Savoy has long been a source of irritation to reactionary whites in New York who figured it lowered the prestige of the practice of "white supremacy" for young white beauties to be cutting rug in the arms of an unsavory looking hepcat, his hair plastered close to his skull as possible with loads of lard, his trousers tapering from bell-bottoms to knaps at the cuffs and his shoes turned up on the end like Chinese snakes, the fireworks variety which to be lighted before they burn into a curling ash. For this reason the Savoy has had more than its share of policemen detailed there over the years, ready at the drop of a hat to lock up everything black and chase everything white back downtown.

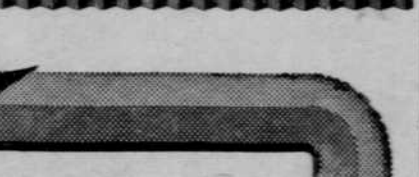
