day War Emergency Conference of the NAACP. Judge Hastie, former Civilian Aide to the Secretary of War, was given the Medal in recognition of services for ad special committee which was adopt ed by the entire NAAC . Delegation. It demanded an end to segregation and discrimination against Negroes in the armed services and called on resident Roosevelt, as Commander in Chief of all the armed forces, to exert his powers to end this discrimination pointing out that the Marines and Coast Guard do not have any colored commissioned officers, that Negro women are not admitted to the WAVES and that Negroes are not admitted in required numbers to the Air Forces. The resolution said, "We call on resident Roosevelt to use his power new or Colored people all over the world will justly regard the "Four Freedoms" as hypocrisy."
