establishments, the wrecking of a beer parlor and the burning of Negro automobiles.

This took place soon after word got around that the white woman had been attacked. There seemed to be no organized mob, but instead many groups of rioters who swarmed into the Negro section.

Fires were set, homes were wrecked. Many cars of white persons were seen going through the streets with hradios, clocks and other articles that had apparently been stolen from these stores and homes.

White men chased a group of Negro youths from a bus station where they were awaiting transportation to an army induction center. The white men were arrested and the Negroes escorted safely from town.

Fearlessness of Sheriff Bill Richardson broke up one crowd of 100 that appeared at the 14 story court house to get the mythical assailant of the woman. Coming to the door with a submachine gun in the crook of his arm, he told the mob he was "damned tired of all this" and ordered the men to "go back to building ships as you should be doing."

CORPS WORKERS URGE TO GET HELMETS AND MASKS

All members of the Omaha Civilian Defense Corps to whom helmets and gas masks are issued are urged to secure them as soon as possible.

Approximately half of the helmets and several hundred of the limited supply of gas masks furnished the Omaha Civilian Defense Corps have been distributed, Roal Carlsen, executive officer of the Civilian Defense Council, reported Saturday.

"I would urge members of the various units to whom this equipment is issued to get their helmets and gas masks at once," Carlsen said. "They should have them on hand ready for use in the next Omaha air raid test which is expected to be held late in July."

BLOOD DONORS RECEIVE CERTIFICATES

Certificates are being issued by the Omaha Civilian defense Council to 750 Omahans, registered with the OCD as blood donors, who have contributed 450 c.c. (approximately one pint) of blood to the blood banks in Omaha hospitals since blood donor registration was started by the OCD emergency medical division in April, 1942.

Other blood donors will receive the certificates as they are called to contribute blood and their donations are reported to the OCD volunteer office, 622 World-Herald Building.

First blood donor to register with the OCD was Miner S. Paddock, 2551 Ida Street, who received Certificate No. 1, Frank Clark, 3002 Dewey Avenue, Martin-Nebraska Bomber plant employee, was second to register, and Robert K. Adams, attorney, 201 North Forty eighth street, was third. All three donated blood April 29, 1942, to the bank at Clarkson hospital which was established in February, 1942, when ten members of Woodmen of the World Camp No. 16 gave the first blood donations.

Paddock, Clark and Adams received their certificates personally from J. E. Davidson, director of Civilian defense, last Tuesday morning.

Since OCD blood donor registration was started, several thousand Omahans have registered as volunteer donors to be called when needed to maintain the blood banks at St. Joseph's Clarkson, St. Catherine's and University of Nebraska hospitals. Many lives have been saved by liquid blood plasma transfusions supplied from these banks.

There is now about 1,000 units of blood plasma on hand in these Omaha blood banks, Dr. C. M. Wilhelm, co-director of the OCD emergency medical division, said.

This is for use locally as needed and for emergencies throughout the Seventh Service Command, U. S. Army. Because of the reasons of these thousands of Omaha volunteers, it is now unnecessary, Dr. Wilhelm said, to call on the Red Cross blood banks in Kansas City, Chicago and St. Paul.
